Have mercy on me, O God.

As St. Paul describes to us, we have positive assurance of God's forgiveness. He explains that we who have been baptized in Christ have been baptized in His death. That is to say that through our baptism, our sinful selves died, and our souls were reborn in God's grace.

St Paul asks us to consider ourselves dead to sin, but alive to God, spurning even the opportunity to sin. But even when we fall from God's graces, that same faith tells us that God will forgive us in our repentance. And that forgiveness is something that we will clearly know without doubt or hesitation when we hear the priest pronounce the words of absolution in confession.

So, we too can pray with King David, "Have mercy on me, O God, in Thy goodness." But our prayer is one of confidence. By faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, we know that our forgiveness is assured. All we need to do is to ask for it. "Our old self is crucified with Him that we may serve sin no longer." And, unlike King David, we have the graces of Baptism, Confession, and Holy Communion.

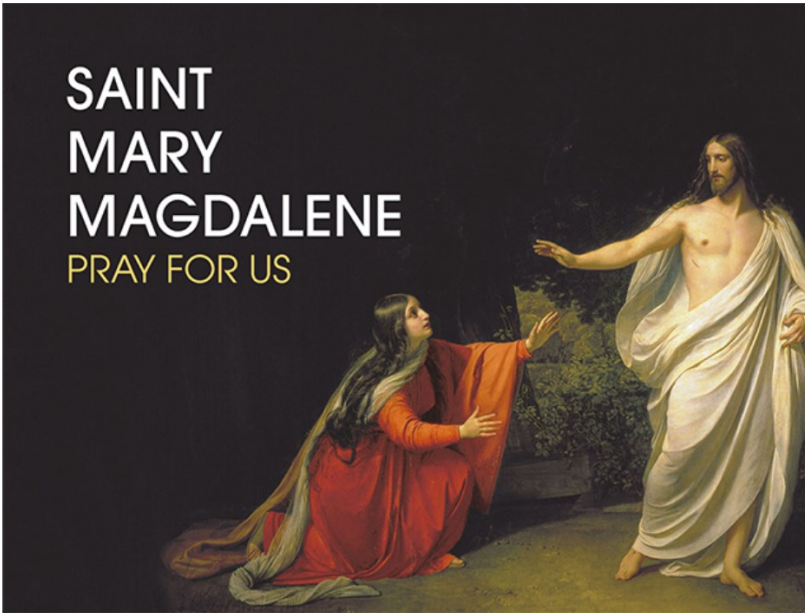

Friday, July 22—6:00 p.m. Mass

St. Mary Magdalen (1st c.) was a friend and devoted follower of Jesus Christ. Formerly she had been a woman of ill repute out of whom Jesus exorcised seven demons. Mary Magdalene has a special place among the Lord's disciples and is mentioned several times in the Gospels. She stood at the foot of the Cross with St. John and the Blessed Mother, and went the next morning to Christ's tomb to anoint his body. As a reward for her great love and faithfulness, she is the first recorded witness of Jesus' Resurrection. It was Mary Magdalene who informed the twelve Apostles that Jesus rose from the dead—for this she is called "Apostle to the Apostles." After Jesus' Ascension into heaven, Mary Magdalene continued her mission as an evangelist, contemplative, and mystic in the heart of the Church. According to the Eastern tradition, she went to Ephesus with the Virgin Mary and died there. St. Mary Magdalene is the patron of women, repentant sinners, penitent women, reformed prostitutes, contemplatives, converts, pharmacists, perfumers, hairstylists, and against sexual temptation. Her feast day is July 22nd.

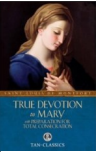

St. Camillus de Lellis

Monday, July 18 - 6:30 a.m. Mass

St. Camillus de Lellis (1550–1614) was a wild, undisciplined youth who became a battle-hardened soldier with a violent temper and a gambling addiction. His bad behavior, combined with a persistent war wound in his leg, left him in poverty. He found work doing odd jobs at a Capuchin friary. Gradually the good influence of the friars inspired him to a better life, and he experienced a true conversion. He sought to join the Franciscans, but was prevented due to his leg wound. He then moved to Rome and worked for a hospital that cared for patients with incurable illnesses. He later became its director as he continued a life of penance and virtue. Seeing that his patients often received poor attention from hospital staff, he devoted his life to providing excellent care for the sick, in whom he saw the face of Christ. He established a religious order of men committed to helping patients who were the most ill, even at the risk of their own well-being, known as the Order of St. Camillus, or the Camillians. For this task he studied for the priesthood and was ordained at the late age of 34. His order gave medical care to anyone in need of treatment. In addition to serving in hospitals, they also served on the battlefield. The Camillians developed into a worldwide relief effort of like-minded medical workers who seek to follow Christ through ministering to the sick. The large red cross on his habit became an international symbol of charitable medical aid. St. Camillus is the patron of the sick, hospitals, nurses, and physicians.
