The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

~HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION~

August 15th is the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and a Holy Day of Obligation. It is an ancient feast of the Church, celebrated universally by at least the 6th century. According to tradition, all of the Apostles were present when Our Lady came to the end of her earthly life and peacefully went to be with Christ in Heaven, an event also known as the "Dormition of Mary." The tomb where her body was laid was found empty, her body being taken up into heaven a short time after she passed into eternal life. The Church's historic belief that the Virgin Mary is presently in heaven reigning as the Queen of Heaven and Earth, in body and soul, next to her Divine Son, was pronounced as infallible dogma in 1950 by Pope Pius XII. The bodily Assumption of Jesus' mother into heaven is a foretaste of our own bodily resurrection at the end of time.

O most sweet Lady and our Mother, by the merits of thy happy death obtain for us holy perseverance in the divine friendship, that we may finally quit this life in God's grace; and unite with the blessed spirits in praising thee and singing thy glories as thou deservest. Amen.

The Triumph of the Immaculate Heart
Our Lady's Promise to a World in Crisis

August is traditionally the month that is dedicated to honoring the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary, whose feast day we will celebrate on August 22 the octave day of the great feast of her glorious Assumption into heaven (August 15).

ST. JOACHIM

FATHER OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY
TUESDAY, AUGUST 16 - 6:00 P.M. MASS

The excellence of the fruit is always a sign of the quality of the tree which bore it. In the case of St. Joachim, the Immaculate Conception of Mary reflects a splendid glory on the chaste union of her parents. The close relationship which existed between the Savior and St. Joachim confers on the good saint a great dignity, raising him above other saints, so that the honor paid to him is reflected upon Christ Himself in a special manner and upon His Immaculate Mother. They loved him and honored him in this world above all others.

We can glean much from the name of Joachim which means, "the Lord's preparation." St. Joachim is pictured in art as having a list in his hands, his head bent down as he thoroughly checks over that list, one might assume, that contained an inventory of his flocks and the fruits of the earth.

Pope Leo XIII, whose baptismal name was Joachim, raised the feast to the rite of double of the second class. The date of the feast was also moved by the Church from the original March 20 to the day after the Assumption.
