## Is Jesus my King?

The universal kingship of Christ is a great truth of the faith.

In the Incarnation and Redemption purchased by Jesus Christ, all is made new. However, the concept of a king is something foreign to our democratic sensibility. Or perhaps the difficulty lies in a kind of fairy-tale idea about kingship and all sorts of pomp.

But if you think about this question you will discover an obvious truth: In fact, we have many kings. We are dictated to by our own desires, our hunger for more, our hunger for the newest, the largest, the coolest, or the trendiest.

The Church says, "Take another look!" She teaches us to look at the world differently. We are asked to reconsider who or what rules our existence and honor the only king that matters, Jesus Christ.

He is a King so great that He stood before a Roman governor in shackles, wearing a crown of thorns. Yet, in the posture of a prisoner, He was victorious. He is a King so great that He offers Himself to us this day, on the Altar, in simply a sliver of bread. But in this bread, something no bigger than a coin, lives all the hope of the world.

This is our King: Fully present, here and now. *But do we recognize Him?* Pilate asked Jesus if He was a King. Maybe we need to ask: *is Jesus my King?* Or are there others? It's worth asking our self: *who, or what, rules my life? Who, or what, holds power over my daily choices?*

Jesus the King calls us to conversion, to renewal, to simplicity, to faith. It is a kind of regime change that is truly a coup for Christ. Let that be our mission; to be foot soldiers of the Lord. If our lives are crowded with other kings, let us return to the only one who matters. Let us join His kingdom and accept His rule so that His ideals, His aspirations, His Commandments shape our reality, what we think, what we do, what we feel, and what we are.

# Act of Consecration of the Human Race to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

*Ordered by Pope Pius XI to be recited on the Feast of Christ the King*

Most Sweet Jesus, Redeemer of the human race, look down upon us humbly prostrate before Thine altar. We are Thine, and Thine we wish to be; but to be more surely united to Thee, behold each one of us freely consecrates ourselves today to Thy Most Sacred Heart.


Many indeed have never known Thee; Many too, despising Thy precepts, have rejected Thee. Have mercy on them all, most merciful Jesus, and draw them to Thy Sacred Heart. Be Thou King, O Lord, not only of the faithful children, who have never forsaken Thee, but also of the prodigal children, who have abandoned Thee; Grant that they may quickly return to their Father's house lest they die of wretchedness and hunger.

Be Thou King of those who are deceived by erroneous opinions, or whom discord keeps aloof, and call them back to the harbor of truth and unity of faith, so that there may be but one flock and one Shepherd.

Be Thou King of all those who are still involved in the darkness of idolatry or of Islamism, and refuse not to draw them into the light and kingdom of God. Turn Thine eyes of mercy towards the children of the race, once Thy chosen people: of old they called down upon themselves the Blood of the Savior; may it now descend upon them a laver of redemption and of life.

Grant, O Lord, to Thy Church assurance of freedom and immunity from harm; give peace and order to all nations, and make the earth resound from pole to pole with one cry; praise to the Divine Heart that wrought our salvation; To it be glory and honor forever.

The Feast of Christ the King was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 as an antidote to secularism, a way of life which leaves God out of man's thinking and living and organizes his life as if God did not exist. The feast is intended to proclaim in a striking and effective manner Christ's royalty over individuals, families, society, governments, and nations.

Jesus said: "My kingdom is not of this world," but it is in the world. He came to establish a kingdom of truth for our intellect; a kingdom of justice and holiness for our will; a kingdom of love and peace for our heart. If we follow Him, He will lead us into His eternal kingdom.

As October, the Month of Holy Rosary comes to a close, this is the perfect time for us to reflect upon the meaning of the Rosary and its significance in our walk of faith. The Most Holy Rosary is a prayer to which the Church attaches rich indulgences. Anytime you recite the Rosary in a church or in your family, you may obtain a plenary indulgence. The conditions for obtaining a plenary indulgence are Sacramental Confession within about a week's time, reception of Holy Communion, and reciting some prayers (at least one Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be) **for the intentions of the Holy Father**. This is different from praying for the Holy Father himself as we do at Mass.

**What, precisely, does it mean to pray for  
the intentions of the Holy Father?**

According to the Church's official decree on indulgences, the Pope's intentions always includes the following objects:

1. The progress of the Faith and the triumph of the Church.
2. Peace and union among Christian Princes and Rulers
3. The conversion of sinners.
4. The uprooting of heresy.

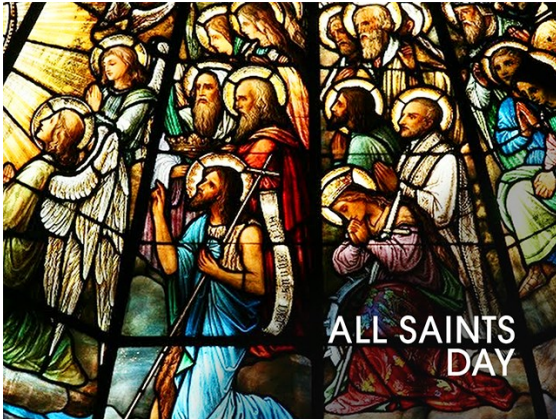
It is very good for you to have these specific intentions in mind when you pray for the Holy Father's intentions. Even if you do not think of them specifically, however, your prayer is still valid, as they are included in the intention of our Holy Mother the Church. Of course the Pope may have other personal intentions, and these can form part of your prayer as well, or not, but this is not necessary.

On November 1st the Church celebrates all her holy ones in heaven, known and unknown, with the feast of All Saints. The solemnity originally began in the 4th century to commemorate all the Christian martyrs killed during those centuries of brutal persecution before Christianity was legalized. There were so many martyrs that a separate feast day could not be given to each one individually, yet, the Church did not want to leave any martyr without proper veneration. A common feast day developed and was usually celebrated in the Easter season. In the 8th century Pope Gregory III consecrated a chapel in St. Peter's Basilica to all the saints and moved the feast day to November 1st.

### ALL SOULS DAY - NOVEMBER 2

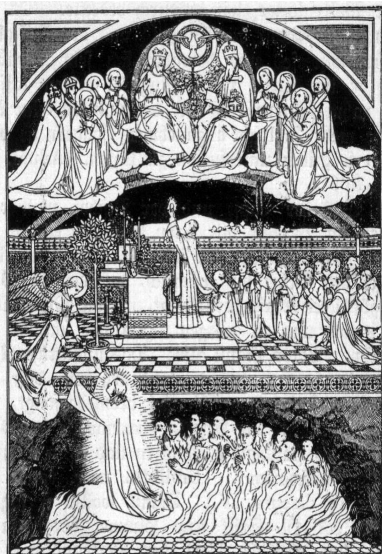

November 2<sup>nd</sup> is All Souls Day, sometimes called the Day of the Dead. On this day, and during the month of November, the Church prays in a special way for the souls of the faithful departed, and individuals pray especially for those whom they have known and loved. The Holy Souls in purgatory died in the mercy of God, thus they are called "holy." However, because they still had attachment to sin at the time of their death, they must undergo the spiritual purification of their souls before they are able to fully love God with their whole heart, mind, and soul for all eternity. As they are nevertheless part of the communion of saints, they depend upon us to help ease their suffering and quickly advance them through their purification so that they can join the saints in heaven. Those in purgatory cannot pray for themselves, this is why they are also called "poor." They can no longer merit anything for themselves and rely entirely on living souls to pray and make sacrifices on their behalf.

### HOW CAN WE HELP THE POOR SOULS

There are many efficacious ways to assist the poor souls who are now suffering in Purgatory, here are but a few;

Pray the Novena to the Holy Souls. Offer up your Holy Communion. Have Masses said for your departed loved ones, especially on the anniversary of his or her death. Pray The Way Of The Cross for Souls in Purgatory. Pray the special Holy Souls Rosary. Obtain indulgences: Indulgences reduce or cancel the temporal punishment that we incur through sin. Give alms: "For almsgiving saves from death and purges away every sin" (Tobit 12:9). Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet for their intention. Recite the prayer of St. Gertrude the Great. When passing by a cemetery, pray the short Eternal Rest prayer. This prayer carries a partial indulgence applicable to the poor souls:

*"Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. And let the perpetual light shine upon them. And may the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen."*




