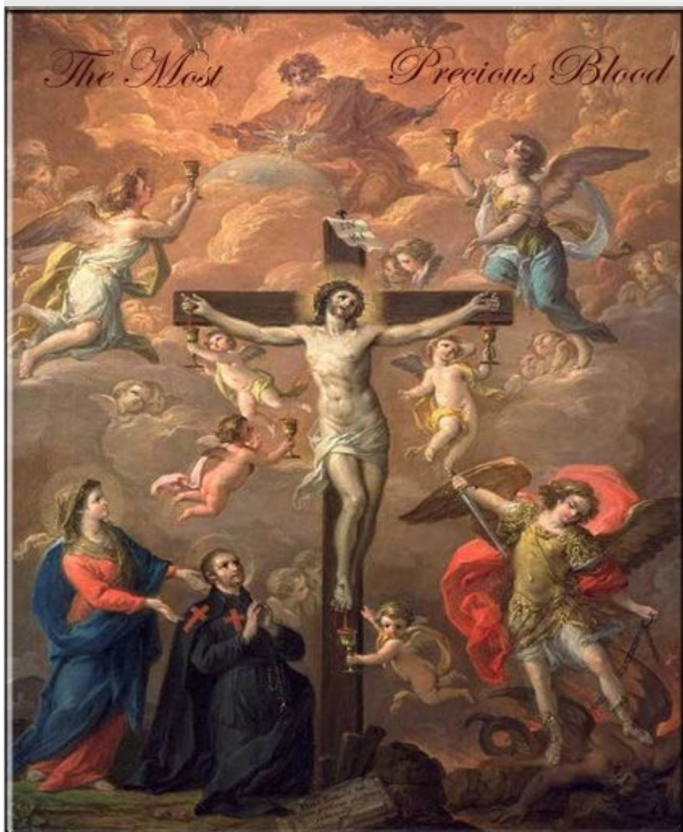

### Feast of the Most Precious Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ

**Saturday, July 1 - 9:00 a.m. Mass**

On July 1, the Feast of the Most Precious Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ is celebrated. It is a reminder that the price of our redemption was high, and in order to underline the importance of this fact the entire month of July is consecrated to the Most Precious Blood. As we were saved through Christ's bloody sacrifice at Calvary, the Church invites us to have great devotion to Jesus' Precious Blood.

Many of the priests of the Institute of Christ the King were ordained on July 1, including our very own Canon Boucheron. We give thanks to God for the many graces they have received throughout their priestly life, and for their service to the faithful entrusted to them. Deo Gratias



### JULY Month of the Precious Blood

The month of July traditionally honors the Most Precious Blood of Jesus. It is the blood of Christ, the Lamb of God, which cleanses us from sin—therefore the Church developed a devotion to Jesus' physical blood and its mystical power, just as it did for His Sacred Heart from which His blood poured out on the Cross. The Precious Blood of Jesus courses through the Church spiritually, giving eternal life to the Body of Christ through the sacraments. Many saints had a devotion to the Precious Blood of Jesus, especially St. Catherine of Siena. Devotion to the Precious Blood spread widely through the preaching of Saint Gaspar del Bufalo, who was a 19th-century priest and the founder of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. This devotion was later approved and then recommended by the Holy See.

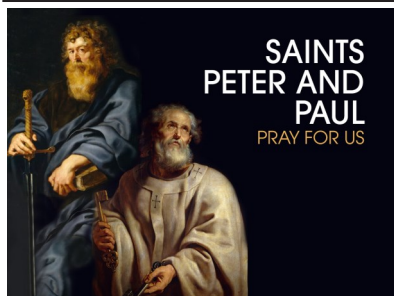

### SAINTS PETER AND PAUL PRAY FOR US

### Sts. Peter & Paul Thursday, June 29 - 8:00 a.m. Mass - Veneration of the relics after Mass -

St. Peter and St. Paul (1st c.) were the foremost Apostles of Jesus Christ; St. Peter was the leader of the Twelve, while St. Paul followed Christ after His ascension into heaven. Together the two saints are the founders of the Church in Rome through their apostolic preaching, ministry, and martyrdom in that city. They are the solid rock on which the foundation of the Catholic Church is built, and they will forever remain her protectors and guides. To them Rome owes her true greatness, for it was under God's providential guidance that they transformed the capital of the Roman Empire into the heart of the Church, with the mission to radiate the Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ throughout the world. Both saints were martyred in close proximity to one another; Peter first, then Paul, though some traditions claim they were killed on the same day. St. Peter was crucified upside down and buried on the hill of the Vatican where St. Peter's Basilica now stands. St. Paul was beheaded on the via Ostia and buried where the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls now stands. St. Peter and St. Paul are the patron saints of Rome and they share a feast day on June 29, a tradition going back to the earliest centuries of the Church.

## President's End of Year Report 2023

Dear Fellow Parishioner,

Eight years ago, a small group of the faithful saw the need for structure and to support the social events of the growing Oratory, the Latin Mass, and our Canon. A group of committed volunteers came together, and the organization titled Friends of St. Patrick's Oratory (FOSPO) was formed.

A little history, the wording to acknowledge this name was already started by the Institute, but was dormant until Canon Buchholz brought it to our attention. Later, the title was adopted as recommended.

The Oratory has flourished and the needs have increased. The FOSPO has responded to the needs and challenges by providing funding and volunteers. A primary focus of FOSPO is to support the traditional activities that provide continuity to our Oratory members and to the Church calendar year. A large measure of our activity is funding and organizing the Holy Day celebrations as requested by our Canon. These social events and other socials enable new and older members to be introduced and welcomed in the Oratory. The socials also provide a platform that encourages all ages to socialize, bond, and eventually feel a sense of family within the Oratory.

The Holy Day meals are provided by receiving some food donations, the rest of the meal and additional costs of the meal are provided by the fundraising activities the FOSPO perform throughout the year. In addition to funding the Holy Day celebrations, we provide a discretionary fund for our Canon's use. In addition, we may fund or offer support to other requests as they occur throughout the year.

The FOSPO is governed by written by-laws. One requirement is to provide an annual report to the members of the Oratory. In the past, we have called a general meeting where yearly reports were given and members of the board of directors were elected. Considerable changes have occurred ...a more streamlined approach was requested. Therefore, after a revision of the by-laws, the general meeting has been replaced by a written annual report available to the Oratory members upon request.

The election of members to the board of directors has been replaced by members volunteering or being asked to serve on the board of directors. To serve on the board of directors one must be a registered member of the Oratory and of adult age.

The board can have up to 15 members. Currently, we have 12. We are therefore seeking additional members to the board. Membership on the board is an easy, pleasant, and rewarding role. Working associates are the best! In a climate of love.

The FOSPO have four meetings per year and we conduct approximately seven activities and five fund raisers per year. (See other side for more about this.)

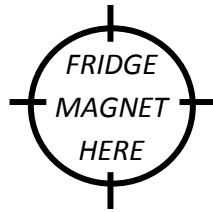
**What To Bring:** Bring a tent, sleeping bag, pillow, and any other necessary camping gear, change of clothes, fishing gear, bug spray.
