January 29: Feast of St. Francis de Sales

Monday, January 29, is the Feast of St. Francis de Sales, Patron of the Institute of Christ the King and of the Diocese of Columbus. Attendees of the 7:00am Mass at St. Leo Oratory may gain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions.

February 2: First Friday & Candlemas

12:00 noon Low Mass (no blessing of candles)
6:00pm Blessing of candles, Procession & High Mass
The Oratory will provide the candles.

This year, we will have nice, larger candles for everyone. *Please <u>do not</u> bring your own candles.*

(The candles that the faithful regularly use for devotions in their homes are appropriately blessed any time during the year by the powerful prayers indicated in the Roman Ritual.)

<u>Ceremonial notes for the 6pm ceremony:</u>

The proper manner of receiving your candle is as follows: kneel at the communion rail. When the priest presents your candle to you, kiss first the candle then his hand. Finally, take the candle from the hand of the priest.

The candles are held lit by the faithful at the following points during the Candlemas liturgy:

- 1. During the procession (snuff the candle once you have returned to your pew after the procession).
- During the Gospel (candles are lit during the Alleluia or Tract and snuffed at the end of the Gospel).
- 3. From the Sanctus until the priest's communion (candles are lit during the Preface and snuffed after the priest consumes the Precious Blood).

SACRAMENTS CORNER

Are you registered?

If you consider St. Leo Oratory as your parish, be sure to register using the forms available at the entrances. Active, registered members fulfill their Sunday obligation weekly or at least regularly at the Oratory, and contribute to the Oratory according to their means.

Conversion to the Catholic Faith

Those who desire to become Catholic are encouraged to contact the rector of the Oratory by phone (614–443–7685) or email (stleo@icksp.org).

Infant Baptism

Parents requesting infant baptism for their child should be active, registered members of the Oratory (otherwise, permission from your pastor must be obtained). Infants should be baptized within the first three weeks after birth (Code of Canon Law, 867 §1). Contacting the rector a few weeks before the child's birth is strongly recommended.

First Communion & Confirmation

Parents should be active, registered members of the Oratory (otherwise, permission from your pastor must be obtained). Contact the rector for information on preparation and enrolling your child for the next First Communion or Confirmation ceremony.

Extreme Unction (Anointing of the Sick)

If an individual is facing a dangerous illness or even death, call 614-443-7685.

Holy Matrimony

Ordinarily, at least one party must be an active, registered member of the Oratory. Couples desirous of marrying at the Oratory should contact the rector a minimum of seven months prior to their desired wedding date for more information. The Oratory wedding policy is available upon request.
