Q&A ON THE SOUND SYSTEM TO BE INSTALLED.

What will our new sound system consist of?

For our new sound system we will be installing a pair of *digitally steerable* array speakers from Renkus Heinz in the place of the old speakers.

What is the benefit?

The new speakers work similarly to a phased array antenna. The new arrays make each driver (that is, each little speaker in the array) play at a slightly different time from the others and, due to the physics of sound waves and interference, make multiple steerable beams of sound that we can precisely control the volume of. This allows us to have the same level of volume at the front of the church as we do at the back, and to direct the sound down towards you. This helps to cut down the reverb produced by the sound system without the need for acoustic panels or more speakers in the main body of the church. Additional speakers will be installed in the choir loft and in the main vestibule.

When will it be installed?

This depends on when the materials arrive and the schedule of the installation team from Kahl's Sound. We are hopeful about installing before Holy Week, though this can't be guaranteed. Our faithful project manager, Mr. Mike Wolf, has completed all of the electrical prep work, saving on time and cost. Our gratitude goes to him for this service.

What is the cost and how are we paying for it?

Speakers of this quality together with installation will cost about \$55,000. A generous benefactor has come forward and made a donation with the purpose of covering this cost and then some. In gratitude, please include this individual in your prayer intentions, especially at Holy Mass and during the recitation of the rosary.

SACRAMENTS CORNER

Are you registered?

If you consider St. Leo Oratory as your parish, be sure to register using the forms available at the entrances. Active, registered members fulfill their Sunday obligation weekly or at least regularly at the Oratory, and contribute to the Oratory according to their means.

Conversion to the Catholic Faith

Those who desire to become Catholic are encouraged to contact the rector of the Oratory by phone (614–443–7685) or email (stleo@icksp.org).

Infant Baptism

Parents requesting infant baptism for their child should be active, registered members of the Oratory (otherwise, permission from your pastor must be obtained). Infants should be baptized within the first three weeks after birth (Code of Canon Law, 867 §1). Contacting the rector a few weeks before the child's birth is strongly recommended.

First Communion & Confirmation

Parents should be active, registered members of the Oratory (otherwise, permission from your pastor must be obtained). Contact the rector for information on preparation and enrolling your child for the next First Communion or Confirmation ceremony.

Extreme Unction (Anointing of the Sick)

If an individual is facing a dangerous illness or even death, call 614-443-7685.

Holy Matrimony

Ordinarily, at least one party must be an active, registered member of the Oratory. Couples desirous of marrying at the Oratory should contact the rector a minimum of seven months prior to their desired wedding date for more information. The Oratory wedding policy is available upon request.
