The return of a favor, the repayment, should exceed in graciousness the favor received. And this makes sense specially in regard to the sinner and the debt he has toward the Majesty of God. Gratitude is due for what is freely given. An exact return of the favor received meets the moral obligation of the beneficiary, but does not include the gratitude he owes. Gratitude is something freely given over and above the amount of repayment. Hence, gratitude exceeds the favor received.

Infant Baptism: Parents requesting Baptism must be active registered members of the Shrine.


First Communion and Confirmation: Children must attend the sacramental catechism classes at the Shrine.
