Would you consider a special gift for this exceptional Anniversary Year? How could you honor St. Joseph better than by being a living stone of his Shrine!



PROJECTS UPDATE

- Stonework Completed! Last touchups and worksite cleanup this week.
- Two large stained glass windows to be reinstalled starting tomorrow.
- Last two large stained glass windows to go to the shop (in Wisconsin) in the next couple weeks after these two windows are reinstalled.
- The main entrance doors on the St. Joseph side of the church have been completely restored and will be returned shortly (brand new hardware to be installed later).
- The main entrance doors on the Blessed Virgin side will be restored on site in the upcoming weeks (brand new hardware to be installed later).
- New large central doors will be ordered to replace the old doors which are too damaged to be properly restored.
- Discussions with electrical engineer are underway to select the best option for new electrical, heating & cooling system.
