

Dear faithful and friends of St Joseph Shrine,

It is with great joy and profound gratitude that I announce the beginning of a Year of Jubilee in preparation and thanksgiving for the 150th Anniversary of the Dedication of St. Joseph Church. Over the nearly 150 years that have passed since then, St. Joseph has stood as a stronghold of Catholic faith, weathering many seasons and serving countless souls, even to this day, as both its parish community and its astonishing structure undergo an historic renewal.

At its Dedication in 1873, St. Joseph was the largest church in Detroit, and the center of parish life for many families. Since the Institute of Christ the King arrived and received the responsibility to administer the parish on October 16, 2016, St. Joseph has once again become a vibrant spiritual home for a growing number of souls drawn to St. Joseph's devotional and sacramental life.

Accordingly, the spiritual life of St. Joseph continues to blossom since its erection as an Archdiocesan Shrine, bringing forth plentiful graces.

- **Partial indulgences** are granted to the Faithful who, having fulfilled the usual conditions, invoke St. Joseph, spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, at the Shrine with a duly approved prayer (e.g. *Ad te, beate Joseph*).
- A plenary indulgence is granted to the Faithful who, under the usual conditions, visit the Shrine on March 19, May 1, or on any day when participating in a group pilgrimage to the Shrine and invoke St. Joseph, spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, at the Shrine.

Let us pray that this Year of Jubilee for the Sesquicentennial Anniversary of the Dedication of St. Joseph will be a fruitful time for all of us in the Archdiocese of Detroit—a time of renewal, and especially a time of renewed commitment to become incarnations of the Institute's motto, "Living the Truth in Charity" (Eph 4:15).

ABOUT THE INSTITUTE OF CHRIST THE KING

The Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest is a Society of Apostolic Life of Pontifical Right whose goal is the honor of God and the sanctification of priests in the service of the Church and souls. Its specific aim is missionary: to spread the reign of our Lord Jesus Christ in all spheres of human life. Our work is carried out under the patronage of the Immaculate Conception, to Whom the Institute is consecrated. The Institute was founded in 1990 by Monsignor Gilles Wach and Father Philippe Mora. Today, the motherhouse and international seminary of the Institute is located in Gricigliano, in the Archdiocese of Florence, Italy.

Recognizing the importance of a deep harmony between faith, liturgy, life, and the power of beauty in attracting the human senses to the things above, an integral part of the Institute's charism is the use of the traditional Latin Liturgy of 1962 for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the other sacraments. Great care for a solemn liturgy, complete fidelity to the doctrine of the Church and the Holy Father, and awareness of the central role of Grace, especially Charity - these are essential elements of the Institute's spirituality, which is drawn from its three co-patrons, St. Benedict, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Francis de Sales. Our motto, taken from St. Paul, is "Live the truth in charity." The Institute operates in more than fifty places in twelve countries, where our priests focus on the care of souls in many different ways. To assist our priests in their apostolic work, the Institute also has clerical oblates. In 2004, a community of religious sisters was canonically established to aid the priests in their mission through prayer and apostolic work.

"Cook the truth in charity until it tastes sweet"- this famous quotation of St. Francis de Sales is the principle of our apostolic work. St. Francis de Sales said, "One drop of honey attracts more bees than a barrel of vinegar." The revealed truth of our Holy Catholic Faith is in itself attractive because of its depth, brilliance, and logic. Wherever it appears clothed in the beautiful garments of charity, it becomes ever more acceptable to those who might otherwise fear its inevitable consequences for our lives and the sharpness with which it cuts through our weaknesses and our excuses.
