FROM OUR VICAR, REV. CANON SEQUEIRA

From Dom Guéranger: The liturgical symbol of the feast of the Ascension is the Pasohal Candle. It was first lit on the night of the Resurrection, and was to remind us, by its forty days' presence, of the time which Jesus spent among His brethren, after He had risen from the grave... After the Gospel has been sung, an acolyte ascends the ambo and extinguishes the Paschal Candle, the sweet symbol of our Jesus' presence for the forty days after His Resurrection. This expressive rite tells us of the widowhood of Holy Mother Church, and that we must turn our hearts to heaven, for it is there that He is to be seen. Alas! how short was His stay here below, and how quickly the time passed!
