

ABOUT THE VIGIL OF PENTECOST

In the early days of the Church, the Pentecost Vigil was one of the times chosen by the Fathers to proceed with the baptisms of catechumens, like the Easter Vigil. Its form therefore follows that of the Easter Vigil, including a first catechetical part. The six prophecies of this first part are indeed part of the ancient baptismal catechesis given to neophytes.

Convert Instruction: Those who wish to become Catholic should call the office to speak to a priest.


Infant Baptism: Parents requesting Baptism must be active registered members of the Shrine.
