

Liturgical note: Please note that the faithful are invited to kneel when a Bishop or a Cardinal processes down the aisle while giving his blessing. Faithful are not to kneel before a 'simple' priest. It is customary to bow to the cross as it processes down the aisle in an act of reverence for the Holy Cross.

Regarding Holy Communion; it is a pious and praiseworthy custom to let the host slowly melt on the tongue before swallowing it and not to chew it out of special reverence and attention to this August Sacrament. Thank you for following these liturgical notes and for helping your children to follow them as well.

Convert Instruction: Those who wish to become Catholic should call the office to speak to a priest.


Infant Baptism: Parents requesting Baptism must be active registered members of the Shrine.


First Communion and Confirmation: Children must attend the sacramental catechism classes at the Shrine.

Holy Matrimony: Couples planning to marry at the Shrine must call the Rectory for the proper instructions.


