Dear faithful,

The third apparition to St Margaret Mary, also known as the Great one, took place in the Octave of the Feast of the Blessed Sacrament in 1675. Our Lord asked for a feast in honor of His Sacred Heart, for the universal Church to make reparation, and to make amends for the indignities which He received during the time He was exposed on the altars. He humbled himself so as to become a fragile host in the hands of the priest, so unworthy to touch Him.

"Behold the Heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing," said our Beloved Savior, "even to exhausting and consuming Itself, in order to testify Its love; and in return, I receive from the greater part only ingratitude..."




Holy Matrimony: Couples planning to marry at the Shrine must call the Rectory for the proper instructions.
