FROM OUR PASTOR, REV. CANON COMMINS

Dear faithful,

If you read again carefully today's Gospel, the details given by the author reveals some very interesting realities that can, as always, be applied to our own spiritual life. The evangelist saint Marc makes it clear that the crowd is gathered in the desert, not in the city, a place of debauchery, and lust. No, the crowd does not gather in the city, but all had to walk a long way in order to receive the miraculous bread from the hand of Jesus and his disciples.

We are no more citizens of the city where all the noise is, we have accepted to follow Christ in the desert where, the mortification of our senses, external senses and internal senses such as our imagination and our memory, is essential to encounter Christ. Yes, indeed it has a cost to follow Christ in this desert, and again not all of the people who heard His voice did follow Him. This mortification of the senses is made possible if we try to quiet all this noise coming from the world. God can only speak in the silence of the heart, and His Word speaks to us in an Eternal Silence.
