LITURGICAL NOTE	SAVE THE DATE
Per the latest liturgical directives given during our annual Institute Chapter, it was decided that the <i>Memorare</i> Prayer for the intentions of our Provincial Superiors (Canon Mat- thew Talarico) as well as the <i>Prayer to Saint Joseph</i> for the ongoing projects at the Shrine, will now be recited during the daily exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in order not to interfere with the Mass itself. This is because the priest nor- mally should remove the chasuble and the maniple in the sacristy before reciting prayers or devotions that are not part of the Mass itself. This will also allow a certain continuity in the liturgy when the organ is playing at the end of Mass. Thank you for your understanding and docility. Convert Instruction: Those who wish to become Catholic should call the office to speak to a priest.


Infant Baptism: Parents requesting Baptism must be active registered members of the Shrine.

First Communion and Confirmation: Children must attend the sacramental catechism classes at the Shrine.


Holy Matrimony: Couples planning to marry at the Shrine must call the Rectory for the proper instructions.


