
### MONTHLY SCHEDULE

### FROM OUR PASTOR, REV. CANON COMMINS

God does not need great means to perform great miracles.

The two parables that we just heard in the gospel, the mustard seed and the leaven, are but images of the Church. No institution on earth, no other form of government, no other religion can claim to have survived against all odds, despite violent persecutions from without, from objectively destructive heresies and schisms from within. From the early times in the catacombs, to the present era of grave relativism, ignorance and indifferentism. God choses very imperfect or seemingly useless instruments, or at least poorly adapted, so that no one can claim for himself the merit and glory of any success except God. This is certainly the most astonishing miracle ever done: the church and its spiritual empire.
