

FROM OUR PASTOR, REV. CANON COMMINS

Dear Faithful, as you know we are currently in Phase II of our Historical Renewal Campaign, and our team is currently working on two important projects: 1. Stone work and structural repairs. During the course of construction, additional deterioration was revealed. The areas identified include: structural components in the attic and sacristies, the building facade, and the bell tower (which requires the installation of a larger scaffolding at the main entrance). 2. New heating/cooling system and complete electrical upgrade. A study performed by DiClemente Siegel Design Inc., is underway. Their findings will be used for the completion of project documents and put out for bids. Consider a special Christmas offering, and please continue to support this massive project so that with your help, we can restore and beautify this gem in our city.


HISTORICAL DOCUMENTARY FILM
