

REGARDING WATER FOR THE VIGIL OF THE EPIPHANY

Please note that several very large water containers will be blessed by the priest on the Vigil of the Epiphany. Once blessed you are welcome to fill up your personal **small** water containers (be mindful of your neighbor...) Due to the increasing number of faithful and the length on the ceremony we kindly ask that you **DO NOT** bring your personal water (personal water bottles will **NOT** be blessed). You are welcome to bring chalk and incense. Thank you for your understanding.

ITEMS TO BE BLESSED

To avoid further difficulties with items disappearing we kindly ask that all items to be blessed be dropped off on Sundays, at the communion rail by the St. Joseph Altar (Large basket). Items will be kept in the sacristy during the week and once blessed, deposited on the communion rail for pickup the following Sunday. Thank you for your understanding.


Members should gather by the communion rail and pray together:
