#### WHAT ARE THESE VOTIVE MASSES FOR THE REMOVAL OF SCHISM?

Since the early twentieth century, every year from January 18th to 25th the Church observes the "Chair of Unity Octave," a week of prayer for the reunion of Christendom-that is to say, for the return of separated Christians to the unity of the Catholic Church. In the words of Pope Pius XI: "the union of Christians can only be promoted by promoting the return to the one true Church of Christ of those who are separated from it, for in the past they have unhappily left it" (Mortalium animos, 10). Without presuming to judge the subjective culpability of those baptized persons born outside the Church, the Church nonetheless is painfully aware that they are in a "state in which they cannot be sure of their salvation" (Pius XII, Mystici corporis, 103), and so it is always a duty of charity to work and pray for the conversion of non -Catholics. The Chair of Unity Octave was inaugurated by the Reverend Paul Wattson, a convert clergyman and the founder of the Greymoor Friars. It received the approbation of Pope Pius X in 1908. This special week of prayer begins on the feast of the Chair of Saint Peter at Rome and ends on the feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul. Every day during the Octave, an additional Oration is added to the Mass of the day, which is taken from the votive Mass ad tollendum schisma, "for the removal of schism," and after Mass special devotions will be recited. There is a different special intention assigned for each day: for the reunion of dissident Eastern Christians with the Holy See, for the conversion of Anglicans, Protestants, for unity among Christians in America, for lapsed Catholics, for the conversion of the Jewish people, and for an increase of missionary zeal.
