

FROM THE PASTOR, REV. CANON COMMINS

St Thomas gives five reasons why we are tempted even after receiving sanctifying grace: First, so that we may receive experience of his justice, then to prevent arrogance, to cofound the devil, that we may be made stronger by experience, and finally that we may know our own dignity since the devil attacks particularly those trying to be faithful to God and holy.

But why does Christ allow himself to be tempted? Because, we have the assurance now that not every temptation is necessarily sinful right away, as it is from the outside as St Thomas says and it can be present without sin. Confront the suggestion from the get-go and asking yourself; is what appears to be good, under these circumstances and in the light of God's plan for me, my salvation and the reward promised, good for my soul?




