THE EASTER VIGIL: AN AFTERNOON LITURGY?

In the Roman Rite, despite the current confusion among the faithful, a vigil is not the Mass of a Sunday or a feast celebrated the evening before: a vigil is a day of **preparation** before a great feast. A vigil has its own Divine Office and its own Mass, which is definitely not an anticipated Mass of the feast. The Vigil of Christmas, for example, celebrated in purple vestments on December 24, in the morning, has its own Mass, which is not yet the Mass of Christmas. Same as several other vigils which have been suppressed in the reforms of Pius XII (1955) and his successors.

The Easter vigil, is not a first Mass of the Resurrection; it is a vigil (celebrated in Rome at 4:45pm in the 1930s), a keeping watch. The incomplete character of the Mass, which omits the Introit, Creed, no Offertory antiphon, Agnus Dei and Kiss of Peace, clearly indicates that the Church, although confident of the Lord's Resurrection, still awaits the actual rising and public manifestation of the Risen Lord. The proper hour for the celebration of the Easter vigil is also traditionally after the Office of None, as in all the ferial days of Lent. According to the first Ordo Romanus, the catechumens were prepared for baptism on the morning of Holy Saturday, around the time for Terce, and then dismissed, to return for the vigil in the evening, which began after the Office of None.
