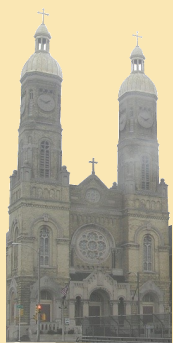

That is the day He received the name Jesus, which was given to Him by the archangel Gabriel. They are a very good subject for private meditation and for family prayer.

Hand Missals For Sale

If you want a "starter" hand missal, which contains all of the readings for weekday and Sunday Masses, please ask one of the ushers. They have copies of the New Marian Missal for sale at \$20. These missals are provided by the Holy Name Society and usually sell for \$39.95.

You can also get a Roman Catholic Daily Missal from the ushers. This is a \$69.95 missal, available at a \$50 subsidized price.

Baptism of Jesus

This week Thursday, January 13th, is the feast day of the Baptism of Jesus. His baptism, at the hand of St. John the Baptist, is recorded in the gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke. It is also specifically referred to in the gospel of John. The Trinity was present at the baptism by the descent of the Holy Ghost, in the form of a dove, and by the voice of God the Father. He said "Thou art my beloved Son, in thee I am well pleased".

The Baptism of Jesus is depicted in the stained glass window, beneath the choir loft, on the south side of our church.
