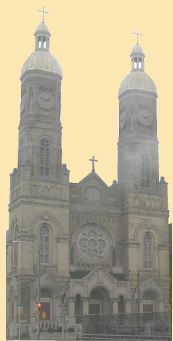

The fire detection and suppression system are being installed to protect the church from a catastrophic fire.

St. Paul

This week Tuesday, January 25th, is the feast day of the Conversion of St. Paul. He is represented in our church by a medallion above the beam over the sanctuary. He is on the right side (St. Peter is on the left). Paul's original name was Saul and he was originally a persecutor of Christians. After his miraculous conversion, he became one of the primary fathers of the Church and wrote 13 of the Epistles in the New Testament. He was arrested in Jerusalem, taken to Rome and eventually beheaded. St. Paul is considered an Apostle.

St. Francis de Sales

This week Saturday, January 29th, is the feast day of St. Francis de Sales, bishop, confessor and doctor of the Church. He is represented in the stained glass window, 3rd from the front, on the Gospel side of our church. St. Francis is one of the primary patrons of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest. In the 17th century, as bishop of Geneva, Switzerland, he converted thousands of Calvinists and helped found the Visitation Nuns along with St. Jane Frances de Chantal. He wrote the highly-respected spiritual book, Introduction to the Devout Life.

LITANY OF THE MONTH - JANUARY

The litany of the month for January is The Most Holy Name of Jesus. The Holy Name is closely associated with the month of January as the circumcision of Jesus took place on the 8th day after His birth. That is the day He received the name Jesus, which was given to Him by the archangel Gabriel. Copies of this litany are in each of the pamphlet racks, both in the north and south vestibules of our church. You are welcome to take as many copies as you wish. They are a very good subject for private meditation and for family prayer.

Last Thursday, January 20th, was the anniversary of the miraculous conversion of the Jew, Alphonsus Rattisbonne. He was a wealthy French banker who hated the Catholic Church. In an inexplicable series of events he ended up in Rome and was convinced to wear a miraculous medal around his neck. Upon stepping inside the church of Sant'Andrea delle Fratte, he saw a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary and was instantly converted.
