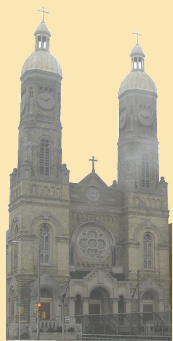
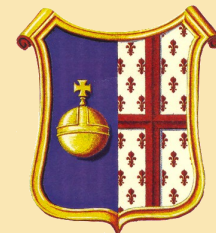

ST. VERONICA

This Friday is the feast day of St. Veronica. She is represented in our church in the sixth station of the cross, long the south wall. She is shown holding her veil on which is imprinted the image of the face of Jesus.

Although the story of St. Veronica is not in the bible, it is so well known that she is considered a saint. There is a parish in the Milwaukee Archdiocese which is named for St. Veronica. Their motto is "Spreading the image of Christ".
