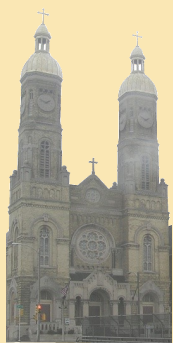
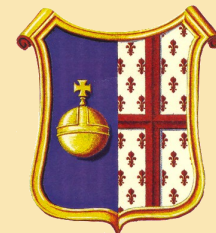

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent and Good Friday. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Corporate Communion

This Sunday, February 20th is when three of our parish organizations receive Holy Communion together. The Christian Mothers and Altar & Rosary Society members use the Gospel side and the Holy Name men use the Epistle side. Please note: to make this corporate communion work, all members should walk up, using all three aisles, as soon as communion starts. Please stand behind the choir members so the ushers can see you.

PALMS FOR ASHES

Thank you to all who contributed palms. They will be burned and the ashes used on Ash Wednesday. Today was the last day to donate palms. Please don't bring any more.

LITURGICAL COLORS

There is a vestment color indicted for each Mass. Each piece of the priest's vestment will be the designated color. It usually carries over into the tabernacle veil and even the missal cover. For Requiem Masses and other Masses for the dead, the liturgical color is black. In addition to Masses on the day of death and the day of burial, it is customary to have a Mass said on the 3rd, 7th or 30th day after death. Black is the color of mourning. When black vestments are used, the tabernacle veil is violet, which is a mitigation of the color black
