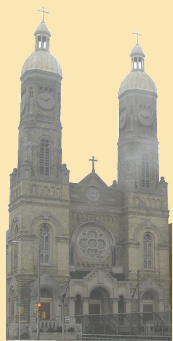
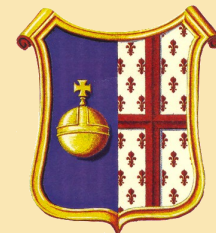

Dear Faithful,

Next Wednesday will be Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the great forty days of our ascent to Easter. In Holy Scripture and in the tradition of the Church, ash is a sign for the call to conversion. Because ash represents death, sin and dust, it awakens in us the cry of repentance. Acknowledging our misery our soul back to God because we know that God's mercy never fails. But without recognition of our sin, mercy is impossible. Repentance, sorrow for our sins is not turning to ourselves; it is about turning to God.

Ash Wednesday, a day of fasting and abstinence, will lead us from earthly food to heavenly food. We fast because we prefer one bread to another. We are invited to receive the bread of the Eucharist: the bread of the mystery of the real presence of Christ, a bread having been baked in ashes.

Lent which begins this week, will be forty days of peace for the soul. This is a time for living anew and the only way for all of us to be raised from our ashes.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent and Good Friday. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations of the Cross will be offered every Friday of Lent at 5:30 pm and Sunday at 9:15 am followed by the veneration of the Relic of the True Cross. We invite you to do your best to attend to these devotions to make a good lent.

HOLY INNOCENTS MASS

On behalf of the Sursum Corda young adult group, all parishioners are cordially invited to attend a Votive Mass of the Holy Innocents at **6:30 pm on Monday, February 28th**. The tradition of celebrating this Mass monthly on the 28th to pray for an end to abortion and the culture of death had been on temporary hiatus, but we are pleased to announce its return beginning with the Mass this month. A special collection will be taken up at this Mass in support of the Milwaukee Women's Care Center, a local pregnancy help center helping over 2,000 women choose life each year. ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday falls on March 2nd this year. Those who attend Mass on that day will receive ashes on their forehead together with the priest's blessing. The ashes come from burning last year's palms.

Ash Wednesday is a holy day of prayer and fasting. It is preceded by Shrove Tuesday and marks the first day of Lent, the six weeks of penitence before Easter. This is a good day to decide on the sacrifices you will make during this holy time.

ST. CASIMIR

Next Friday, March 4th, is the feast day of St. Casimir. He was born in the 15th century in Poland and is the patron saint of Lithuania. He is especially honored by Lithuanian youth. St. Casimir is honored in our church by two statues and a medallion. The statues are the right statue on the Epistle-side altar and on the south side of the porch. His medallion is the 4th from the front on the Gospel side.

In Poland and Lithuania there are over 50 churches named for St. Casimir. There are also churches named for him in the United States, including one in Milwaukee.
