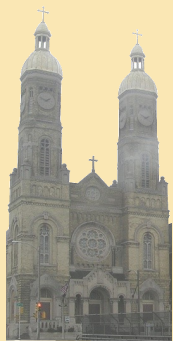

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent and Good Friday. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

PRAYER BEFORE A CRUCIFIX

There is a Plenary Indulgence available each Friday during Lent for saying this prayer after receiving Holy Communion:
 Look down upon me, good and gentle Jesus while before Thy face I humbly kneel and, with burning soul, pray and beseech Thee to fix deep in my heart lively sentiments of faith, hope, and charity; true contrition for my sins, and a firm purpose of amendment. While I contemplate, with great love and tender pity, Thy five most precious wounds, pondering over them within me and calling to mind the words which David, Thy prophet, said of Thee, my Jesus: "They have pierced My hands and My feet, they have numbered all My bones." Amen.
 There is a prayer card in the north pamphlet rack which explains how to gain a plenary indulgence.

LITANY OF THE MONTH – MARCH

March includes the feast day of St. Joseph, the foster-father of Jesus. He is the patron saint of workers and of fathers. Pope Pius IX declared him to be both the patron and the protector of the Catholic Church, in addition to his patronages of the sick and of a happy death, because he died in the presence of Jesus and Mary.
 This litany is a simple one and would be a good introduction to reciting a daily litany in our households. St. Joseph is a model to all fathers. He is our spiritual father and provides for our well being.

The Stations of the Cross will be offered every Friday of Lent at 5:30 pm and Sunday at 9:15 am followed by the veneration of the Relic of the True Cross. We invite you to do your best to attend to these devotions to make a good lent.

ST. THOMAS AQUINAS

This Monday, March 7th, is the feast day of St. Thomas Aquinas, one of the patron saints of the Institute. St. Thomas is represented in our church by a stained glass window, the 4th from the front on the **G o s p e l s i d e**. St. Thomas is considered the greatest theologian in the Church. His most famous writing, the "Summa Theologica", took five years to write and is still considered the foundation of Church teaching. He also wrote hymns that are familiar to all Catholics including the two which are sung as part of Benediction.

Pope St. Gregory the Great

This Saturday, March 12th, is the feast day of Pope St. Gregory the Great. He is represented in our church by a stained glass window, specifically, the one above the choir loft on the north side. Below the choir loft, in the same window, is St. John Vianney. Gregorian chant is named for St. Gregory.

The Church has many saints named Gregory, including four Popes. However, only this saint is called the Great. He founded seven monasteries, including one in Rome, which had been his family mansion. He was elected Pope at a time when Rome was in the middle of a great plague. He organized pilgrimages through the city and during one, St. Michael the Archangel appeared waving his sword and the plague ended.
