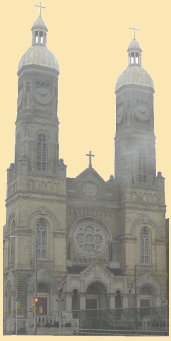

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent and Good Friday. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

LITANY OF THE MONTH – MARCH

March includes the feast day of St. Joseph, the foster-father of Jesus. He is the patron saint of workers and of fathers. Pope Pius IX declared him to be both the patron and the protector of the Catholic Church, in addition to his patronages of the sick and of a happy death, because he died in the presence of Jesus and Mary.

This litany is a simple one and would be a good introduction to reciting a daily litany in our households. St. Joseph is a model to all fathers. He is our spiritual father and provides for our well being.

St. Joseph

This Saturday, March 19th, is the feast day of St. Joseph. St. Joseph is represented both inside and outside our church.

Inside is a wooden statue on the south wall, near the pulpit. Outside there is a statue in the grotto west of the rectory.

Both statues show Joseph holding the child, Jesus.

St. Joseph was the foster father of Jesus and protector of the Holy Family. The month of March is dedicated to St. Joseph and you can read about his various attributes and titles in the litany to St. Joseph. There are copies of that litany in both pamphlet racks.

HIGH BORDER DECORATIONS

We have a variety of religious symbols around our church, essentially at the top of the walls. One of the most obvious, and fierce looking, is the lion. These represent Christ, the Lion of Judah. The lion is every watchful, just like God who watches over us.

Cherubs, who look like children with wings, come from the 2nd highest choir of angels. They are pure spirits who are always attending God.

Also, there are images of the eagle. His majestic stance reminds us of resurrection.

There are also fish, which was a secret symbol that early Christians used to identify each other during the time that it was illegal to be Christian.

JOIN THE HOLY NAME SOCIETY

The St. Stanislaus Chapter of the Holy Name Society is an active men's organization designed to provide service to the parish and increase the personal sanctity of the society members.
