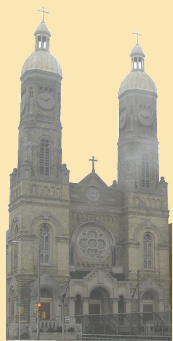

Laetare Sunday is a pause of Holy Joy and spiritual comfort which the Church, like a good mother, give us in the middle of Lent so that we may renew our strength. LITANY OF THE MONTH – MARCH

Rose Colored Vestments

There is a vestment color indicated for each Mass. Each piece of the priest's vestment will be the designated color. It usually carries over into the tabernacle veil and even the missal cover.

Today, March 27th, is Laetare Sunday and the liturgical color is Rose. Rose is a combination of white and violet, a combination of joy and repentance. Rose is also used on Gaudete Sunday, which is the Third Sunday in Advent. Laetare and Gaudete are Latin words which mean rejoice. Both of the above Sundays give us a pleasant interruption in the main penitential seasons of the liturgical year.

MAKE FRIENDS IN HEAVEN

Whenever you gain a plenary indulgence, one of the poor souls in purgatory is released to heaven. A plenary indulgence removes the temporal punishment for forgiven sins. By your indulgenced actions you have tapped into the treasury of satisfaction won by Jesus and the saints. This is a very good way to make a friend in heaven, who will then pray for you. The actions which can merit a plenary indulgence include reciting a 5-decade rosary in church, with devout meditation on the mysteries. At St. Stanislaus, we have the opportunity to do this before every Mass. There are specific requirements for gaining a plenary indulgence. These are called "the usual conditions" and are spelled out in a pamphlet in the north pamphlet rack.
