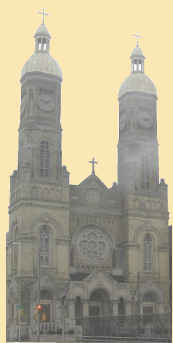

Communion for Homebound

During Eastertide, the Church recommends us to receive Holy Communion. The priest visits those who cannot go to church.

Out of respect for the Blessed Sacrament, the home should be prepared, on a table covered with a clean white cloth, there should be: a crucifix, two lighted candles, a glass of water for the purification of the priest's fingers, a white napkin or a small towel.

When the priest arrives, someone should meet him at the door with a lighted candle and lead him to the sick. As the priest enters the room he sprinkles the sick person, the room and those present with Holy Water and places the Blessed Sacrament on the table. Those who are present kneel. If the sick person makes his Confession, those present leave the room and when they return they kneel until Holy Communion and if needed the Sacrament of Extreme Unction called also Anointing of the Sick are given. It is a good supernatural comfort for those who cannot go to church to receive Holy Communion at home.

Our Lady of Grace

This Monday, April 4th, is one of the feast days of Our Lady of Grace. In our church, Our Lady of Grace is honored by a ceiling painting, on the Gospel side, near the front. The first meaning of Our Lady of Grace refers to her own holiness. But very early on, Mary was invoked as the uniquely blessed one in the Sub tuum praesidium, fourth century and as the mother of mercy (see the acathist hymn, perhaps around 530). She is also the one who intercedes for us with God to obtain His grace.

Our Lady of Graces is the patron saint of the diocese of Faenza, Italy. According to a tradition, in 1412, Mary appeared to a local woman. Mary was holding broken arrows symbolizing protection against God's wrath and promised an end to the plagues. Maybe we need to be praying to Our Lady of Grace in these trying times.

VEILED CRUCIFIXES AND STATUES

Starting with Passion Sunday, April 3rd this year, we enter a period of the Church year known as Passiontide. This includes the last two weeks before Easter. It is during this time that the crucifixes and statues in church are covered or veiled. The veils are violet, matching the liturgical color of Lent.

The reason for covering the crucifixes and statues is associated with the Gospel read on Passion Sunday in which "Jesus hid himself".

Other changes we will note during this time are the shortened prayers at the foot of the altar, the same as at Requiem Masses. Also, on the Friday of Passion Week, we honor Our Lady with the feast of the Seven Dolors of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
