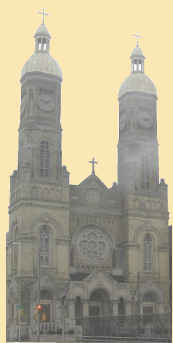

St. Kunegunda

Today, July 24th, is the feast of St. Kunegunda. She is represented in our church by the right statue on the side altar, on the gospel side of the sanctuary.

St. Kunegunda is from the 13th century and was the daughter of King Bela IV and niece of St. Elizabeth of Hungary. She married King Boleslaus V of Poland, at age 16. Upon his death, she became a Poor Clare at Sandeck, Poland, in the Convent which she had founded. St. Kunegunda built churches and hospitals and served the poor and sick. She is also known as St. Kinga and St. Helen of Poland. She is the patron saint of salt miners.

MAKE FRIENDS IN HEAVEN

Whenever you gain a plenary indulgence, one of the poor souls in purgatory is released to heaven. A plenary indulgence removes the temporal punishment for forgiven sins. By your indulgenced actions you have tapped into the treasury of satisfaction won by Jesus and the saints. This is a very good way to make a friend in heaven, who will then pray for you.

The actions which can merit a plenary indulgence include reciting a 5-decade rosary in church, with devout meditation on the mysteries. At St. Stanislaus, we have the opportunity to do this before every Mass.

There are specific requirements for gaining a plenary indulgence. These are called "the usual conditions" and are spelled out in a pamphlet in the north pamphlet rack.

JULY LITANY

The litany for July is The Most Precious Blood of Jesus. Having this litany reflects the fact that the feast of The Precious Blood of Jesus is in July. Pope Saint Pius X set the feast day for July 1st. It is still celebrated on that day on the traditional calendar.

We honor the precious blood of Our Savior because that is the means He used to redeem us. The blood which was shed by Christ in the Agony, the Scourging, the Crowning with Thorns and His Crucifixion is the price He paid. Heaven was opened for us by His blood.
