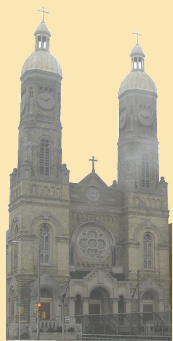

The Assumption of Mary

Monday is the feast of The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In our church, this is represented in the rose window over the choir. It is the top image in that window.

The Assumption of Mary is a dogma of the Church. It says that Mary was bodily taken up into heaven at the end of her earthly life. The dogma does not say whether she died or simply fell asleep. It is interesting that the Jerusalem church dedicated to the Assumption is named the Dormition.

St. Stanislaus Kostka

Monday is also the traditional feast day of St. Stanislaus Kostka. He is represented in our church by the left statue on the Epistle-side altar and also by a medallion. His is the 5th medallion, on the Epistle side. He was named for our St. Stanislaus, Bishop and Martyr.

St. Stanislaus Kostka walked from Poland to Rome and become a novice in the Jesuits. He led a very exemplary life and died at age 17. He is buried in Rome in the church of St. Andrew al Quirinale, where visitors can also visit the rooms in which he lived.

St. Hyacinth

This Wednesday, August 17th, is the feast day of St. Hyacinth. He is represented in our church by a medallion and a statue. His medallion is the 4th from the front, on the Epistle side. His statue is the left statue on the Gospel-side altar.

St. Hyacinth was a Dominican priest in Poland. He is credited with saving the Blessed Sacrament and a statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary from a chapel in Kiev during an invasion. It was miraculous because the weight of the stone statue was beyond his natural abilities. He is the patron saint of those in danger of drowning.
