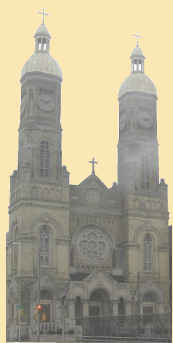

Our Lady of Czestochowa

This Friday, August 26th, is the feast day of Our Lady of Czestochowa who is also called The Black Madonna. This image is represented at St. Stanislaus on the outside of our church, facing south. It is a large mosaic, said to be the largest mosaic of Our Lady of Czestochowa in the world.

The original image is in Poland and has a fascinating history. It is believed that it was painted by St. Luke on the wood of a table made by Jesus Himself when He was an apprentice carpenter under St. Joseph. St. Helen found the picture in Jerusalem and took it to Constantinople where it stayed until it had to be moved in the eighth century. It went to Poland and ended up in Czestochowa. The monks of St. Paul of the Desert guard the picture in the monastery of Jasna Gora. An invasion in the 15th century left the image with slash marks. In the 17th century John Casimer declared her Queen of the Crown of Poland. Jasna Gora is now a repository of priceless art work and other historical items.

HIGH BORDER DECORATIONS

We have a variety of religious symbols around our church, essentially at the top of the walls. One of the most obvious, and fierce looking, is the lion. These represent Christ, the Lion of Judah. The lion is every watchful, just like God who watches over us.

Cherubs, who look like children with wings, come from the 2nd highest choir of angels. They are pure spirits who are always attending God. Also, there are images of the eagle. His majestic stance reminds us of resurrection.

There are also fish, which was a secret symbol that early Christians used to identify each other during the time that it was illegal to be Christian.
