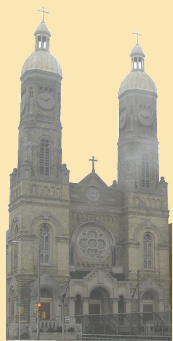

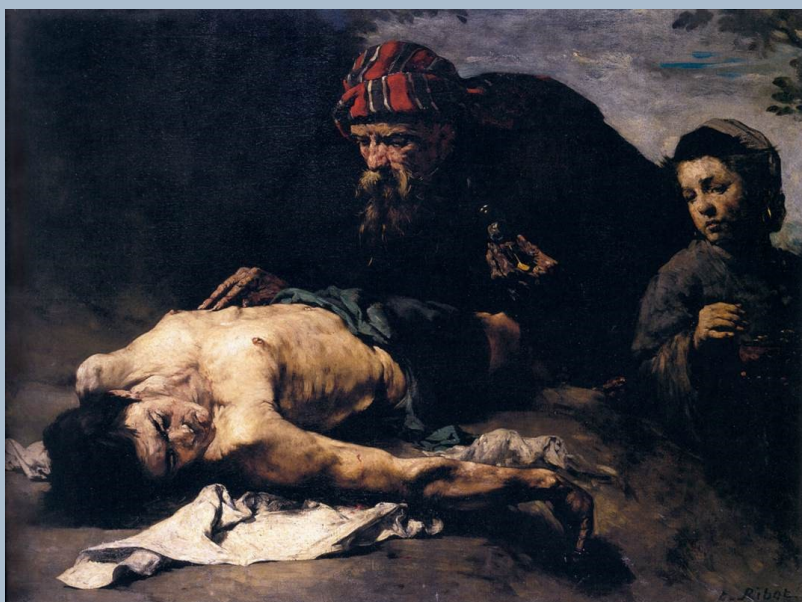

BEHEADING OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

This Monday, August 29th, is the feast day of the beheading of the forerunner of Jesus, St. John the Baptist. He was held in prison, primarily because he told Herod Antipas that he was in an incestuous relationship with his brother's wife, Herodias. Her daughter, Salome, was granted one wish after dancing for Herod. She asked for the head of John on a dish and that is how he was martyred.

St. John the Baptist is represented in the stained glass window, below the choir loft, on the south side. In this window he is depicted baptizing Jesus in the Jordan River. The window is located next to our baptismal font.

BAS-RELIEF

The carved work of art above and behind our main altar is called bas-relief. This simply means that it is not a flat work of art but is raised up slightly off the surface. It is a faithful replica of the bas relief which goes back to the early days of our church but which disappeared during the 1960's renovation.

The story told in this artwork is fascinating. Pictured is St. Stanislaus appearing before the king to defend his purchase of an estate from a man named Piotr. The man had died and his sons claimed that Stanislaus had not paid for the property and that they wanted it back. Bishop Stanislaus raised Piotr from the dead and he both testified that the property was paid in full and reprimanded his sons for their dishonesty.
