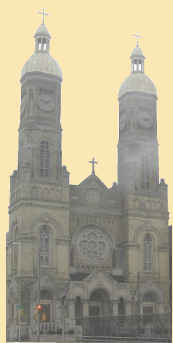

St. Therese of the Child Jesus

Monday, October 3rd, is the feast day of St. Therese of the Child Jesus, also known as the Little Flower or Therese of Lisieux. She is represented in our church in a stained glass window, first from the front, on the Gospel side.

St. Therese was born in France in 1873 and died there in 1897.

She became a Carmelite nun and developed a very simplistic way of serving God, known as The Little Way. After her death, many people read about her and followed her lead to holiness. Although she never went on a mission, St. Therese is the patron of missions. She is also the Institute of Christ the King's secondary patroness.

MONTH OF THE ROSARY

October is the month of the rosary. An important feast day in October is the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, October 7th. That day was chosen because on that day in 1571 Catholic forces repelled Moslem forces in the famous Battle of Lepanto. This battle involved over 400 warships and was won by the Catholic forces only through miraculous intervention. Two years before that battle, Pope Pius V had issued a papal bull establishing the rosary as an official devotion of the Church. Then, as the battle was imminent, he asked for the faithful to pray the rosary. It was those prayers which led to the victory, which led to naming Mary Our Lady of Victories which was later changed to Our Lady of the Rosary.
