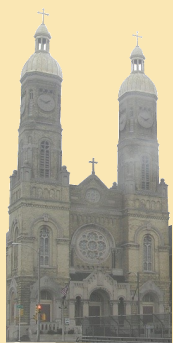

MONTH OF THE POOR SOULS

November is the month of the poor souls in Purgatory. It is customary to visit a cemetery each day November 1st through the 8th. A plenary indulgence is granted, under the usual conditions, for reciting prayers for the poor souls. The indulgence applies only to the poor souls.

You can go to a cemetery where deceased members of your family are buried or any other cemetery and say prayers of your choosing.

One possibility to consider is a prayer card in the pamphlet rack in the north vestibule which can be used for this purpose. It is called "Litany for the Poor Souls in Purgatory". Some people like it because it includes prayers for just about everyone you can think of from your family and acquaintances. These will also be available by the parking lot entrance for a short while.

LITANY OF THE MONTH NOVEMBER

The litany of the month for November is for the Souls in Purgatory. Copies are available in the pamphlet racks in both the north and south vestibules. Please take some home and consider reading it out loud. This can be particularly efficacious if you have a family and make this part of your group prayers.

The church is made up of the Church Militant (that's us), the Church Triumphant in Heaven and the Church Suffering in Purgatory. As we pray for the poor souls, they may be released from Purgatory and become our friends.

NOVEMBER 1st –30th MONTH OF THE POOR SOULS

November is the month of the poor souls in purgatory. It is customary to visit a cemetery each day November 1st through the 30th. A plenary indulgence is granted, under the usual conditions, for reciting prayers for the poor souls. The indulgence applies only to the poor souls. You can go to a cemetery where deceased members of your family are buried or any other cemetery and say prayers of your choosing.
