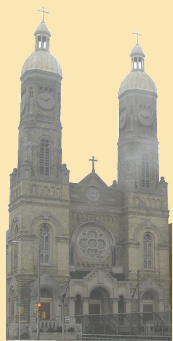

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK



Dear Faithful,

On the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year, the Gospel confronts us with some very sobering thoughts: the end of the world, the Second Coming of Christ and the Divine Judgement. This Gospel filled the hearts of the Christians of the early church with joy and hope. The Christians of modern times say, "Yikes! God will look at my resume!"

Why do we think that? Because we do not trust God enough; we think He is a rival. Saint Augustine says that a thick and shapeless tree trunk would never believe that it could become a statue, admired as a miracle of sculpture, and would never consent to submit itself to the chisel of the sculptor who sees by his genius what he can make of it.

To meditate about the end of the world is not morbid, it is liberating: we understand that our desire to be in control is vain. This is one of the grandest delusions in human history: we want to be in control. We are not in control and never will be. This Gospel invites us to pause and consider this question: How much better would my life be if I surrender completely to God? If I ask Him to transform my life from a wooden log to gorgeous sculpture? At the Heart of the Catholic Faith is conversion. God is constantly inviting us to convert. Conversion of the soul is a daily process.
