

We are pleased to have you join us in this venerable act of worship and invite you to return often.





the evil of abortion.


The Oratory's two scheduled



Catechism Corner

THE TWO GREAT COMMANDMENTS

Lesson 15 from the Baltimore Catechism

188. Besides believing what God has revealed, what else must we do to be saved?

Besides believing what God has revealed, we must keep His law.

If you love me, keep my commandments. (John 14:15)
189. Which are the two great commandments that

contain the whole law of God?

The two great commandments that contain the whole law of God are:

Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul, and with thy whole mind, and with thy whole strength;

Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself.

And one of them, a doctor of the Law, putting him to the test, asked him, "Master, which is the great commandment in the Law?" Jesus said to him, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul, and with thy whole mind.' This is the greatest and the first commandment. And the second is like it, 'Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself.' On these two commandments depend the whole Law and the Prophets." (Matthew 22:35-40)

190. What must we do to love God, our neighbor, and ourselves?

To love God, our neighbor, and ourselves we must keep the commandments of God and of the Church, and perform the spiritual and corporal works of mercy.

My dear children, let us not love in word, neither with the tongue, but in deed and in truth. (I John 3:18)

191. Which are the chief corporal works of mercy?

The chief corporal works of mercy are seven:

1-To feed the hungry.

2-To give drink to the thirsty.

3-To clothe the naked.

4-To visit the imprisoned. 5-To shelter the homeless.

6-To visit the sick.

7-To bury the dead.

192. Which are the chief spiritual works of mercy? The chief spiritual works of mercy are seven:

1-To admonish the sinner.

2-To instruct the ignorant.

3-To counsel the doubtful.

4-To comfort the sorrowful.

5-To bear wrongs patiently.

6-To forgive all injuries.

7-To pray for the living and the dead.
