PRECEPT ON FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to **FAST** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these days one full meal is permitted. Two smaller meals which added together would not equal one full meal is allowed if necessary.

All Catholics 14 years old and older are obliged to **ABSTAIN** from meat, soup and gravy made from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.

ST. FRANCIS DE SALES ON FASTING DURING LENT

"I thought of speaking to you of the conditions which render fasting good and meritorious. Understand that of itself, fasting is not a virtue. It is a virtue only when it is accompanied by conditions which render it pleasing to God.

We find some people who think that to fast well during the holy season of Lent it is enough to abstain from eating some prohibited food. We know very well that it is not enough to fast exteriorly if we do not also fast interiorly, and if we do not accompany the fast of the body with that of the spirit.

Now among all the conditions required for fasting well, I will select 3 principal ones...

The first condition is that we must fast with our whole heart, willingly, wholeheartedly, universally and entirely.

The second condition is never to fast through vanity but always through humility.

The third condition necessary for fasting well is to look to God and to do everything to please Him, withdrawing within ourselves in imitation of a great saint, St. Gregory the Great who withdrew into a secret place where he remained for a time."

The Second Sunday of Lent

"...Let us not wait till we have betrayed Him:
let us at once acknowledge that He is our Lord
and our God. We are soon to be keeping the
anniversary of His Sacrifice; like the Apostles,
we are to see Him humbled by His enemies and
bearing, in our stead, the chastisements of
Divine Justice. We must not allow our faith to
be weakened, when we behold the fulfilment of
those prophecies of David and Isaias, that the

Messias is to be treated as *a worm of the earth* [Ps. xxi. 7], and be covered with wounds, so as to become like a *leper, the most abject of men*, and the *Man of sorrows* [Is. liii. 3,4].

We must remember the grand things of
Thabor, and the adorations paid Him by Moses
and Elias, and the bright cloud, and the voice of
the Eternal Father. The more we see Him
humbled, the more must we proclaim His glory
and divinity; we must join our acclamations
with those of the Angels and the Four-andTwenty Elders, whom St. John,

(one of the witnesses of the Transfiguration,)
heard crying out with a loud voice:

The Lamb that was slain, is worthy to receive power and divinity, and wisdom, and strength, and honour, and glory, and benediction!



Part One-The Profession of Faith-Section One "I believe" – "We believe"

CHAPTER THREE

Man's Response to God

I Believe

25. How does man respond to God who reveals himself?

Sustained by divine grace, we respond to God with the obedience of faith, which means the full surrender of ourselves to God and the acceptance of his truth insofar as it is guaranteed by the One who is Truth itself.

26. Who are the principal witnesses of the obedience of faith in the Sacred Scriptures?

There are many such witnesses, two in particular: One is Abraham who when put to the test "believed in God" (Romans 4:3) and always obeyed his call. For this reason he is called "the Father of all who believe" (Romans 4:11-18). The other is the Virgin Mary who, throughout her entire life, embodied in a perfect way the obedience of faith: "Let it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38).

27. What does it mean in practice for a person to believe in God?

It means to adhere to God himself, entrusting oneself to him and giving assent to all the truths which God has revealed because God is Truth. It means to believe in one God in three Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

28. What are the characteristics of faith? Faith is the supernatural virtue which is necessary for salvation. It is a free gift of God and is accessible to all who humbly seek it. The act of faith is a human act, that is, an act of the intellect of a person - prompted by the will moved by God - who freely assents to divine truth. Faith is also certain because it is founded on the Word of God; it works "through charity" (Galatians 5:6); and it continually grows through listening to the Word of God and through prayer. It is, even now, a foretaste of the joys of heaven.
