### Veneration of the Relic of the True Cross.

... Although no longer mentioned in current legislation, the custom of making a simple genuflection before a publicly exposed relic of the True Cross or another relic of the Passion remains in force.

The *Ceremonial of Bishops* indicates that the relic of the True Cross (*and by extension other relics of the Passion*) is incensed with three double swings. (*Like the Gospel, the altar cross and the Celebrant*) Other relics and images of the saints are incensed with two double swings.

All relics are incensed while standing, at the difference of the Holy Sacrament, always incensed, while kneeling.

This *Motu Proprio* is all about Sacred Music that means that faithful **must** actively participate in the Sacred Music during the High Mass.
