St. Pius X on the Sacred Music - 2

It is in the 5<sup>th</sup> paragraph of *Tra le sollicitudini* that St. Pius X use the expression "*active participation*" for the first time: "Being moved with the most ardent desire to see the true Christian spirit flourish again in every way among all the faithful, the first thing to which We must turn our attention is the holiness and dignity of the temple. There Our people assemble for the purpose of acquiring the Christian spirit from its first and indispensable source, namely the active participation in the most Sacred Mysteries and in the public and solemn prayer of the Christ. It is vain to hope for such copious blessings from Heaven if our worship of the Highest, rather than ascending with an odor of sweetness, again puts into our Lord's hands the scourges with which the unworthy profaners were once driven out of the temple by the Divine Redeemer."

We should note that "active participation" concerns "the holiness and dignity of the temple", and that what is being participated in is "the most Sacred Mysteries" and "the public and solemn prayer of the Church".

The participation Saint Pius X talk about must clearly be consistent with "*holiness*," "*dignity*," "*sacred mysteries*," and "*solemn prayer*..."

That this is Saint Pius X's intention is further made clear by the opening paragraph of his Motu Proprio, which shows that among the concerns he has (*Tra le sollicitudini* means *among the concerns*), the main one is "*promoting the beauty of the house of God*":

The main pastoral duty: maintaining and promoting the beauty of the house of God. Here the august mysteries of religion are celebrated, here the faithful gather to receive the grace of the sacraments, to assist at the Holy Sacrifice of the altar, to adore the most Blessed Sacrament and to be united at the Church's common prayer in her public and solemn liturgy.
