

#### Tarcisius's Teaching. Which Missal? -2

So, let's continue our talk on which Missal to use.

Here at St Paul's Oratory, we generally use the Missal of 1962... Generally, because we received the *indult (Pope's permission)* to use the pre 1955 Missal for Holy Week and the Vigil of Pentecost.

So, which Missal? Both of them are incomplete:

- If you choose a pre-1955: you will miss some daily Masses of Saints canonized by Pius XII... but you have the Holy Week...
- If you choose a post-1955, choose a 1962, and try to find a booklet for Holy Week and Pentecost Vigil... (*Canon Dumain was telling me that the day the Oratory will be rich enough to pay a secretary, a nice booklet will be made and provided...*)

Choosing a Missal, look also at how much are they complete: All Missals have Sunday Masses and main Feasts. Daily Missal have also all the "daily Masses": the *Temporal (Sunday and Lenten's Day)* and the *Sanctoral (Saint of the day)*. But it is not all: there is also three other parts:

Votive Mass.

- M.P.A.L.
- Proper of America.

The last part is present in all the American Missal. It is hard to find: *just 20 pages...* (*About that, guys! Let's work on holiness: Canon Dumain doesn't stop teasing me about the fact that on these 20 pages, none of these Saints are American... Also, he showed me the Proper of his Diocese, in France – not the biggest so far – but still: more than a hundred pages of local saints...*)

The 2<sup>nd</sup> part: M.P.A.L. means *Missa Pro Aloquibus Locis: (now that you know that it is clear; isn't it?)*. M.P.A.L. means *Masses for particular places -and congregations*. They are proper Masses common to multiple Dioceses or Congregation, without being in the Roman Calendar. They can be celebrated anywhere, on their proper, day as a Votive Mass. This part is more and less the same in every Missal: The Editor, in order to reduce the size of the Missal, eliminate the less popular (*or at least those he judges the less popular*).

The first part is more the one giving troubles: the Votive Mass. There are many of them... and since many priests do not use the most part of them, many Editors do not add all of them in the Daily Missal. Unfortunately for the faithful of St Paul's Oratory, Canon Dumain is not like many priest... He is one of a kind (Trust me: it is better like that!) The least of his defect is his love for this treasure of Votive Mass. So, we will have to talk more about it...
