Tarcisius's Teaching. Which Missal? -3

Since Canon Dumain silenced me last week, let's return to our conversation...

You can choose between a pre-1955 Missal, (with the complete Holy Week, but not some other Masses), or a 1962 Missal with all the Masses but not the complete Holy Week. (Last week and this week are a perfect example: in a pre-1955, May 1st was the feast of St. Philip & James. They were moved to May 11th by Pope Pius XII when he places St. Joseph on May 1st, without octave. Beforehand, his feast was on Wednesday during the 3rd week of Easter, with octave... (Why Wednesday during the 3rd week? ... because St. Pius X moved it from the 3rd Sunday after Easter, where it was since 1870.)

Another example: May 6th: feast of the martyrdom (failed) of St. John, at the Latin Gate. It was celebrated on May 6th since the VI century, until 1960, when it was placed amidst the Missa Pro Aloquibus Locis... So not every Missals have it...

Why all this change? Good question...

- Some says: it is because the Church likes to make it difficult when it could be simple... (it is not totally wrong...)
- Some, says: the Vatican has some money invested in Print Shop... (fake news: it will have been smart... but too smart for us.)
- Some says (and it is the real reason) that it is because there were always some modifications in the Church Calendar, based mainly on the development of the dogma, and sometimes on some particular devotions of Popes...
