#### FROM THE DESK OF THE RECTOR

Early in the morning of this day, Jesus sets out for Jerusalem, leaving Mary His Mother, and the two sisters Martha and Mary Magdalene, and Lazarus, at Bethania. The Mother of sorrows trembles at seeing her Son thus expose Himself to danger, for His enemies are bent upon His destruction; but it is not death, it is triumph, that Jesus is to receive to-day in Jerusalem. The Messiah, before being nailed to the cross, is to be proclaimed King by the people of the great city; the little children are to make her streets echo with their Hosannas to the Son of David; and this in presence of the soldiers of Rome's emperor, and of the high priests and Pharisees: the first standing under the banner of their eagles; the second, dumb with rage. 'Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Sion! Shout for joy, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold thy King will come to thee; the Just and the Savior. He is poor, and riding upon an ass, and upon a colt, the foal of an ass.' [Zach. 9:9]. Jesus, knowing that the hour has come for the fulfilment of this prophecy, singles out two from the rest of His disciples, and bids them lead to Him an ass and her colt, which they would find not far off.

The holy fathers have explained to us the mystery of these two animals. The ass represents the Jewish people, which had been long under the yoke of the Law; the colt, upon which, as the evangelist says, no man yet hath sat [Mark 11:2], is a figure of the Gentile world, which no one had ever yet brought into subjection.

Thus did God, in His power over men's hearts, procure a triumph for His Son, and in the very city which, a few days later, was to clamor for His Blood. This day was one of glory to our Jesus, and the holy Church would have us renew, each year, the memory of this triumph of the Man-God. Shortly after His birth, the Magi came from the extreme east, to offer to the King of the Jews their gifts and their adorations: but it is Jerusalem herself that now goes forth to meet this King. Each of these events is an acknowledgment of the kingship of Jesus; the first, from the Gentiles; the second, from the Jews. From The Liturgical Year by Dom Prosper Guéranger.

# SHORT EXPLANATION OF THE CEREMONIES OF HOLY WEEK

PALM SUNDAY: Blessing of the Palms, Procession, Mass

The glorious mystery of this day is the triumphal entry of Our Lord Jesus Christ into Jerusalem and His proclamation as King. The first ceremony is the blessing of the palms. We have an idea of its importance from the solemnity used by the Church in this sacred rite. The palms are blessed in a dry Mass, a Missa Sicca. The prayers the Church uses for this blessing together with the sprinkling with holy water and the incensation, impart a virtue to these branches, which elevates them to the supernatural order. They become a means for the sanctification of our souls and the protection of our persons and dwellings. The second ceremony which immediately follows is the procession. It represents our Savior's journey to Jerusalem, and His entry into the city. To make it the more expressive, the branches that have just been blessed are held in the hand during it. With the Jews, to hold a branch in one's hand was a sign of joy: And you shall take to you, on the first day, the fruits of the fairest tree, and branches of palm-trees, and boughs of thick trees, and willows of the brook, and you shall rejoice before the Lord your God [Lev. 23:40].

At the close of the procession a ceremony takes place, which is full of the most sublime symbolism. On returning to the church, the doors are found to be shut. A hymn in honor of Christ our King is sung with its joyous chorus; and at its end the doors are opened only after being struck by the staff of the cross. This ceremony represents the entry of Jesus into the heavenly Jerusalem for which the earthly one was only a representation. The sin of our first parents had shut it against us; but Jesus, the King of glory, opened its gates by His cross.

The third part of to-day's service is the offering of the holy Sacrifice. During the singing of the Passion, the faithful should hold their palms in their hands, and, by this emblem of triumph, protest against the insults offered to Jesus by His enemies. As we listen to each humiliation and suf-

fering, all of which were endured out of love for us, let us offer Him our palm as to our dearest Lord and King. How poignant is it to be most adoring Our Lord, than when He is most suffering.

**HOLY THURSDAY:** Mass, Altar of Repose, Stripping of the Altars, Mandatum

On this day, the Church solemnly renews the mystery of the Last Supper, since Our Lord Himself said on this day to His Disciples: *Do this for a commemoration of Me* (Luke 22:15). The Mass is celebrated as a feast day Mass since it is the day that Our Lord instituted the Sacrifice of the New Law, the Holy Eucharist (Matt. 26:26-28), and also a new priesthood for this Sacrifice (Luke 22:15). This is a bitter-sweet moment because by this time it was already known that Judas was to betray Our Lord. For these reasons, after the Gloria, the bells are rung no more. No sign of peace is given since it would be a reminder of the sacrilegious hypocrisy of Judas.

Two hosts are consecrated at the Altar on this day. The second will be taken in procession to the Altar of Repose which is decorated as a garden to represent to us the garden of Gethsemane, where Our Lord had His Agony before His Passion. The Altar of Repose represents also the prison in which Our Lord was held and where many insults and outrages were given Him all through the night that first Holy Thursday.

Following the Mass and the procession to the Altar of Repose is the ceremony of the stripping of the altars which represents Our Lord in the hands of His enemies who strip Him of His garments, exposing Him to the insults of the rabble. During this ceremony Psalm 21 is sung.

Lastly follows the *Mandatum*, in which the Church shows how much She treasures every recommendation of Our Lord, including His condescension to wash the feet of His Disciples.
