## FROM THE VICE RECTOR: CANON JEAN-BAPTISTE COMMINS

Dear faithful of the Shrine,

A few quotes on the Divine Liturgy of the Church, as a good preparation for today's talk:

Pope St. Pius V: By virtue of Our Apostolic Authority We give and grant in perpetuity, that for the singing or the reading of Mass in any church whatsoever this Missal (that is to say, the Tridentine Mass), may be followed absolutely, without any scruple of conscience or fear of incurring any penalty, judgment or censure, and may be freely and lawfully used.

Pope John XXIII: "Of its very nature Latin is most suitable for promoting every form of culture among peoples. It gives rise to no jealousies. It does not favor any one nation, but presents itself with equal impartiality to all and is equally acceptable to all. ... 'For the Church, precisely because it embraces all nations and is destined to endure to the end of time ... of its very nature requires a language which is UNIVERSAL, IMMUTABLE, and NON-VERNACULAR'"

Cardinal Ratzinger: "A freedom without restraint, with the risk to lose itself in improvisation, may not be reconciled with the essence of the Faith of the liturgy. The greatness of the liturgy, one must repeat, is exactly because it must escape the arbitrary. Going back to being utilitarian did not make the liturgy more open, but instead has made it poorer".

## RESURRECTION FROM ASHES CAMPAIGN

### UPDATE:

Preparation work continues at the Shrine, prepping the bundling for the installation of the steel.

Update of work that was done in October 2017:

- Bond Beam work has been completed at the Altar and North and South Transept areas.



- The Pediment wall at the far east side of the building over the Altar have been prepped for tuckpointing.
- Simpson Gumpertz & Heger, SGH, has been reengaged to provide guidance on the tuckpointing and stone weatherproofing at the pediment walls at the Altar.
- Wiss, Janney, Elstner Associates, WJE, is working out the details for the Southwest corner of the building.
- John Lyle and Associates, JLA, has been engaged to work with CDOT on closing half of 64th street during the steel installation.
- Organ Loft has been demolished and debris has been removed.
- Steel is in fabrication!

Welcome to the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest, an international religious community with over 90 apostolates worldwide whose aim is the defense and propagation of the reign of Christ in all areas of human life. The Shrine of Christ the King, Provincial Headquarters of the Institute and Chicago architectural landmark, has maintained its presence in the Woodlawn community since 2004, but sustained significant damage after a 3-alarm fire on October 7, 2015. Grateful to Cardinal Blase Cupich and the Archdiocese of Chicago for entrusting the Shrine's property ownership and restoration to our care and thankful to our neighbors at the First Presbyterian Church of Chicago, we are able to continue our weekend and evening traditional liturgies in Latin in the third floor Upper Room of their building (6400 S. Kimbark Ave). Morning weekday Masses are offered in the Priory chapel (6415 S. Woodlawn Ave), where St. Benedict's social hall is located on the lower level.

Throughout the year, extensive opportunities for spiritual growth accompany Shrine life through conferences, various devotions, and cultural events for all ages. Special importance and emphasis is given to the spiritual education and formation of our youth in their sacramental preparation taught by the priests.
