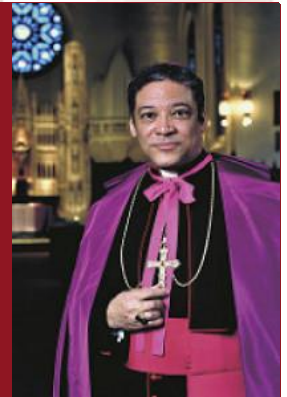

The 8:00am Mass on Saturday, December 16, will include a sermon and devotions in this tradition. After Mass, everyone is welcome for a reception with Filipino foods in St. Benedict Hall.

RESURRECTION FROM ASHES CAMPAIGN

National Fund for Sacred Places Grant Challenge

The National Fund for Sacred Places announced in early October that the Shrine is invited to be a grant recipient. To learn more about this exciting opportunity which gives national visibility to our restoration project, please pick up informational materials at the entrance to the Upper Room.

All capital grants awarded from the National Fund for Sacred Places require a cash match. Since the Shrine has made a request for \$250,000 in order to help finance the new roof system project, it is up to us to raise 2:1 matching funds in the amount of \$500,000 in pledges, cash gifts, or in other ways described on the printed informational materials. Thus, because of the grant, every \$1 given to the restoration fund after October 1, 2017, basically becomes \$1.50. **We are setting the goal of raising \$500,000 in pledges or cash by Easter Sunday, April 1, 2018, in order to receive the \$250,000 grant from the National Fund.**

What can I do to help the Shrine meet the challenge of this goal?

Pray the St. Joseph prayer each day for the campaign's success (prayer cards at entrance to the Upper Room). Consider a 3 year pledge to the restoration campaign and fill out the pledge form available at the entrance to the Upper Room. Tell other people the exciting news about the Shrine's participation in the National Fund and explain the challenge of our goal: \$500,000 in gifts and pledges by Easter Sunday, April 1, 2018. Printed materials for distribution are available in the vestibule to the Upper Room and online at www.shrinelandmark.org. The blog on this website gives regular updates on the construction so that donors can see the progress made possible by their dollars. Attend the Shrine's annual benefit dinner on March 10, 2018, and invite friends to attend.

To date we have already raised \$20,319 in cash toward our \$500,000 goal.

Welcome to the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest, an international religious community with over 90 apostolates worldwide whose aim is the defense and propagation of the reign of Christ in all areas of human life. The Shrine of Christ the King, Provincial Headquarters of the Institute and Chicago architectural landmark, has maintained its presence in the Woodlawn community since 2004, but sustained significant damage after a 3-alarm fire on October 7, 2015. Grateful to Cardinal Blase Cupich and the Archdiocese of Chicago for entrusting the Shrine's property ownership and restoration to our care and thankful to our neighbors at the First Presbyterian Church of Chicago, we are able to continue our weekend and evening traditional liturgies in Latin in the third floor Upper Room of their building (6400 S. Kimbark Ave). Morning weekday Masses are offered in the Priory chapel (6415 S. Woodlawn Ave), where St. Benedict's social hall is located on the lower level.

We cordially invite you to join us for Mass, devotions, and our conferences to strengthen you on your spiritual journey. Plenty of non-permit street parking is available on S. Kimbark Avenue and E. 64th Street and a parking lot is available adjacent to the rectory. Please check our bulletin for mass times and upcoming events.
