TRADITIONAL EPIPHANY CUSTOMS

The *Rituale Romanum* foresees a special **blessing of Epiphany water**, which is to be blessed on the Eve of the Epiphany. This Holy Water, which recalls the waters of the Jordan, is a visible reminder of Christ's Divinity as revealed by His heavenly Father at His Baptism (which is commemorated liturgically on the Octave day of the Epiphany): *This is My beloved Son, in Whom I am well pleased.* "This blessed Epiphany water also recalls the water changed miraculously by Christ into wine at Cana as a foreshadowing of the institution of the Holy Eucharist.

Chalk is traditionally blessed by a priest on the feast of the Epiphany according to the blessing from the *Rituale Romanum*, so that each family may mark the names of the three Magi over their doors, as a witness of their faith and protection against evil.

O Lord God, bless this Thy creature chalk that it may be used for the salvation of the human race. Through the invocation of Thy most Holy Name grant that whoever shall take of this chalk and write with it upon the doors of his house the names of Thy saints, Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar, may through their merits and intercession receive health of body and protection of soul. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Blessing of the Home with blessed water and chalk

Having sprinkled the rooms of the house with the blessed Epiphany water, the priest (or if he is unavailable, the father of the household) takes the blessed chalk. He writes the initials of the three Wise Men, connected with Crosses, over the inside of the front door (on the lintel, if possible). Then, he writes the year breaking up the numbers and the year so that they fall on both sides of the initials. It should look like this:

20 C+M+B 19

the "20" being the millennium and century, the "C" standing for the first Wise Man, Caspar, the "M" standing for Melchior, the "B" standing for Balthasar, and the "19" standing for the decade and year. It is also popularly believed that the Kings' initials also stand for "**Christus mansionem benedicat**" ("*Christ*

GETTING TO KNOW OUR COMMUNITY AT THE SHRINE OF CHRIST THE KING

Welcome to the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest, an international religious community with over 90 apostolates worldwide whose aim is the defense and propagation of the reign of Christ in all areas of human life. The Shrine of Christ the King, Provincial Headquarters of the Institute and Chicago architectural landmark, has maintained its presence in the Woodlawn community since 2004, but sustained significant damage after a 3-alarm fire on October 7, 2015. All Masses are offered in the St. Joseph Crypt Chapel (6415 S. Woodlawn Ave), where St. Benedict's social hall is located on the lower level of the Priory. A parking lot is available adjacent to the rectory.

To access St. Joseph Crypt Chapel:

- **Back entrance behind the Priory from the parking lot, down the ramp.**
- **Gate and staircase, accessible from Woodlawn Ave. Between Church & Priory**
