## FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Dear Faithful,

The Catechism of the Council of Trent—also known as the Roman Catechism—states that “so various are our temporal and spiritual necessities, that we must have recourse to prayer as the best means for communicating our wants and receiving whatever we need. For since God owes nothing to anyone, we must ask of Him in prayer those things we need, seeing that He has constituted prayer as a necessary means for the accomplishment of our desires, particularly since it is clear that there are blessings which we cannot hope to obtain otherwise than through prayer. Thus devout prayer has such efficacy that it is a most powerful means of casting out demons; for there is a certain kind of demon which is not cast out but by prayer and fasting.”

Here at our Oratory of Saint Leo the Great, my hope first and foremost is that the oratory be a place of prayer and devotion. That is why, from the beginning, I have desired to institute a weekly **Holy Hour of Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament Exposed**, followed by Benediction. Therefore, **starting this week, there will be a weekly Holy Hour at 7:00pm on each Friday**, as part of our experimental, startup liturgical schedule.

The Holy Hour will begin with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and end with a few chants and Benediction. The center portion of the hour is reserved for silent adoration. Time spent in silence before the Blessed Sacrament is a privileged time for private recitation of the Rosary, meditation and other spiritual exercises. Who can doubt the graces reserved to those who spend time in Our Lord's Real Presence!

### Obtaining plenary indulgences for the Faithful

#### Departed during the month of November

During the month of November, the Church gives the faithful opportunities to obtain plenary indulgences applicable to the souls in Purgatory.

For this year only, the Church has extended these possibilities through the entire month of November, according to the October 23rd, 2020 decree of the Apostolic Penitentiary, which reads:

“a- the Plenary Indulgence for those who visit a cemetery and pray for the deceased, even if only mentally, normally established only on the individual days from 1 to 8 November, may be transferred to other days of the same month, until its end. These days, freely chosen by the individual believers, may also be separate from each other;

b- the Plenary Indulgence of 2 November, established on the occasion of the Commemoration of all the deceased faithful for those who piously visit a church or oratory and recite the “Our Father” and the “Creed” there, may be transferred not only to the Sunday before or after or on the day of the Solemnity of All Saints, but also to another day of the month of November, freely chosen by the individual faithful.”

To acquire a plenary indulgence applicable to souls in Purgatory, it is necessary to perform the work to which the indulgence is attached and to fulfill the following **three conditions**: sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Sovereign Pontiff, all within a few days before or after the indulgenced act. *It is further required that all attachment to sin, even venial sin, be absent.*

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### **About the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest**

The Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest is a Society of Apostolic Life of Pontifical Right whose goal is the honor of God and the sanctification of priests in the service of the Church and souls. Its specific aim is missionary: to spread the reign of our Lord Jesus Christ in all spheres of human life. Our work is carried out under the patronage of the Immaculate Conception, to Whom the Institute is consecrated.

The Institute was founded in 1990 by Monsignor Gilles Wach and Father Philippe Mora in Gabon, Africa, where we still have missions. Today, the motherhouse and international seminary of the Institute is located in Gricigliano, in the Archdiocese of Florence, Italy.

Recognizing the importance of a deep harmony between faith, liturgy, life, and the power of beauty in attracting the human senses to the things above, an integral part of the Institute's charism is the use of the traditional Latin Liturgy of 1962 for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the other sacraments. Great care for a solemn liturgy, complete fidelity to the doctrine of the Church and the Holy Father, and awareness of the central role of Grace, especially Charity – these are essential elements of the Institute's spirituality, which is drawn from its three co-patrons, St. Benedict, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Francis de Sales. Our motto, taken from St. Paul, is "Live the truth in charity." The Institute operates in more than fifty places in twelve countries, where our priests focus on the care of souls in many different ways. To assist our priests in their apostolic work, the Institute also has clerical oblates. In 2004, a community of religious sisters was canonically established to aid the priests in their mission through prayer and apostolic work.
