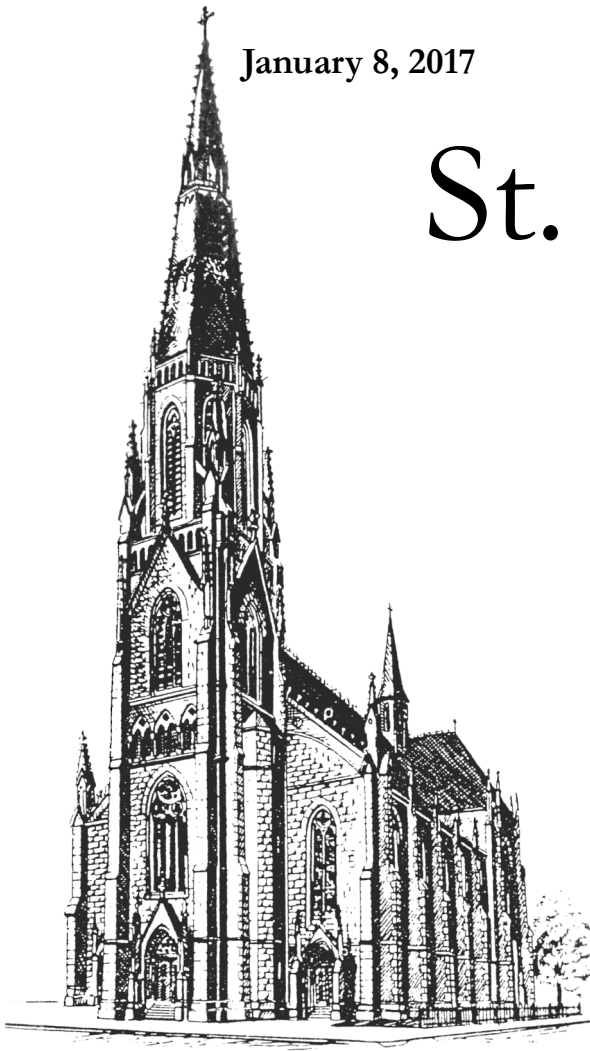
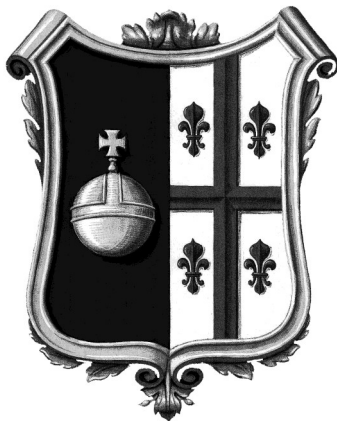

## ***What is the history of the Feast of the Holy Family?***

The Feast of the Holy Family is the annual liturgical celebration honoring Our Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and Saint Joseph, as a family. The primary purpose of this feast is to present the Holy Family as a model for families. The feast was instituted by Pope Leo XIII in 1893 and set on the Sunday within the Octave of the Epiphany; that is to say, on the Sunday between January 7 through January 13. Veneration of the Holy Family was formally begun in the 17th century by St. François de Laval, the first bishop of New France. He also founded the Confraternity bearing its name. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us!

On Sunday, February 5th at 11am, Archbishop Vigneron will install Canon Michael Stein as Parish Pastor. The traditional ceremony of installation will precede the Solemn High Mass. For the occasion, Rev. Canon Matthew Talarico, Provincial for the USA will also be present.
