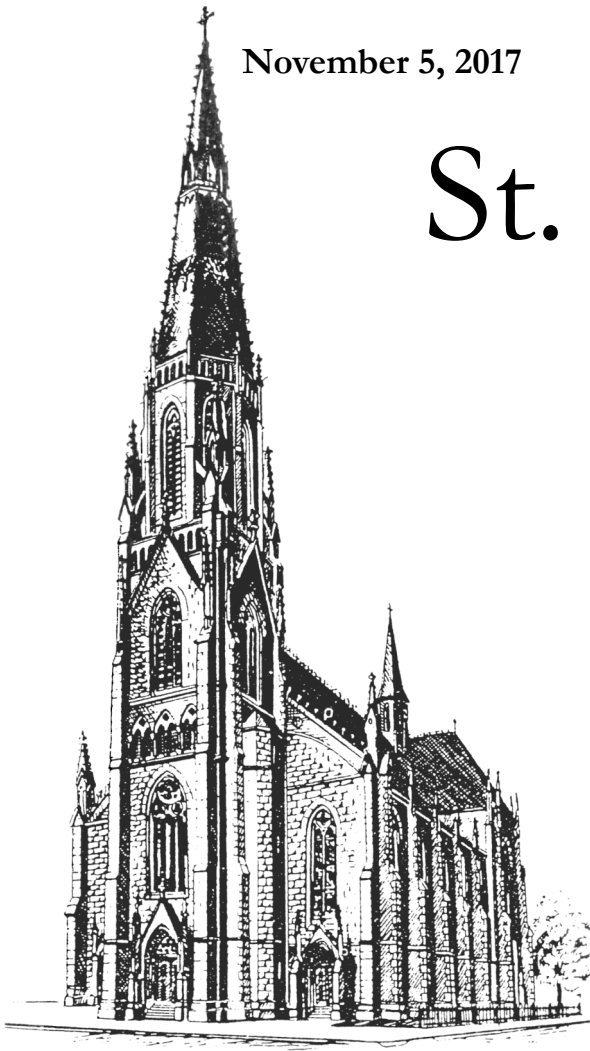

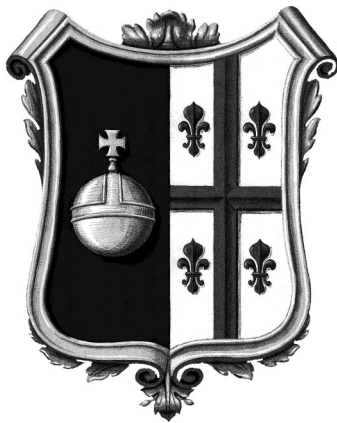

Dear Oratory Faithful,

The month of November is traditionally dedicated in praying for the repose of the Poor Souls in Purgatory. To uphold this pious tradition, Holy Mother Church grants a plenary indulgence to the Poor Souls if we visit a cemetery and pray for the repose of their souls from Nov. 1 – Nov. 8 under the normal conditions: 1) Sacramental Confession, 2) Communion and 3) Prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father within a few days of the work done and without attachment to sin, even venial (cf. *Enchiridion of Indulgenced Prayers*, 1968). When done outside of these dates, a partial indulgence is granted to the Poor Souls.

Please join us today for the All Saints Party after the 11am High Mass.

Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in Peace. Amen

To Have Mass Offered

As we are blessed to have two priests at St. Joseph Oratory, there are twice as many daily Masses.

Why have Masses offered? St. Thomas Aquinas says : "The celebration of Holy Mass is as valuable as the death of Jesus on the cross." St. John Marie Vianney said: "There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, He would have given it to us." St. Thomas also says that Masses are multiplied because of the soul's limited openness to Grace at that actual moment. As the souls in Purgatory cannot pray for themselves, St. Ambrose points out the importance of Masses to be offered for the deceased: "We have loved them during life; let us not abandon them in death, until we have conducted them by our prayers into the house of the Lord." Yet the Mass isn't limited to the deceased as St. Anselm suggests to us earthly pilgrims: "A single Mass offered for oneself during life may be worth more than a thousand celebrated for the same intention after death."
